

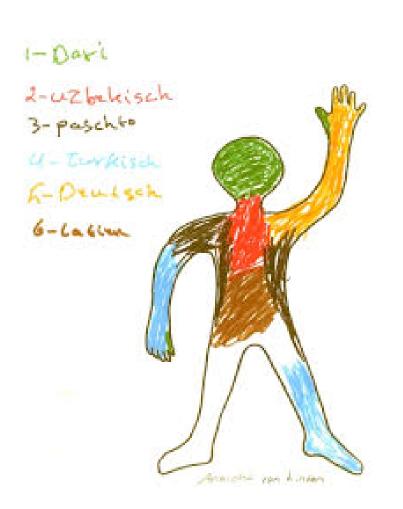

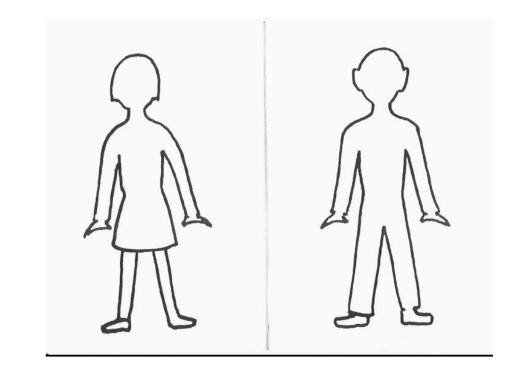
WHAT IS A LANGUAGE PORTRAIT?

- A creative tool to reflect on the languages in your life.
- You fill in a body silhouette with colors to represent the languages you know, use, feel, and live.
- It's not about how well you speak a language it's about how it lives in you.
- It's your language story, visualized!



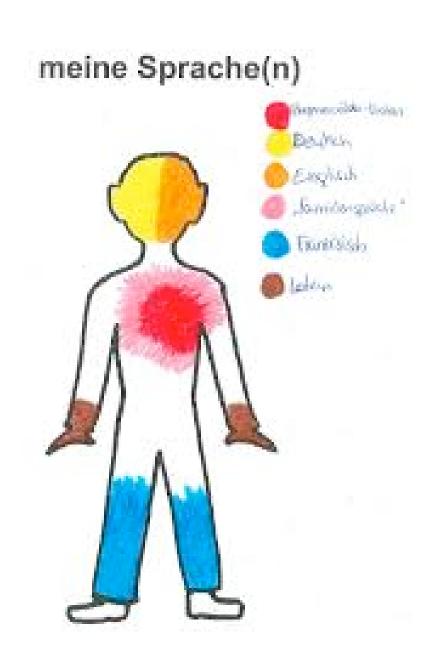


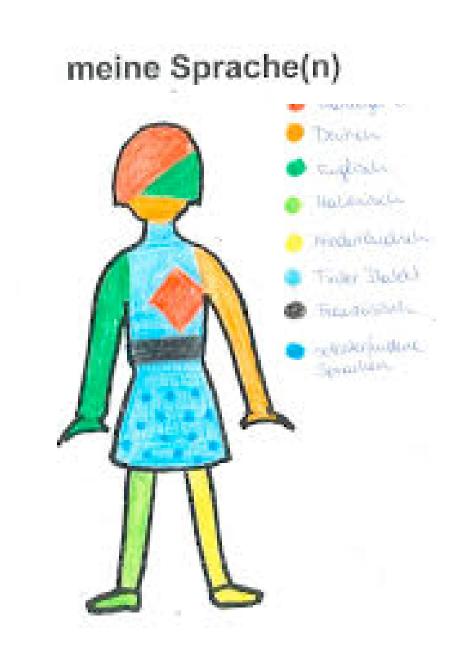
- First used in schools in the 1990s (Germany & Austria)
- Popularized by researcher Brigitta Busch
- Inspired by "body-mapping" in health, education, and social work
- Languages + Emotions + Belonging = Your Language Portrait

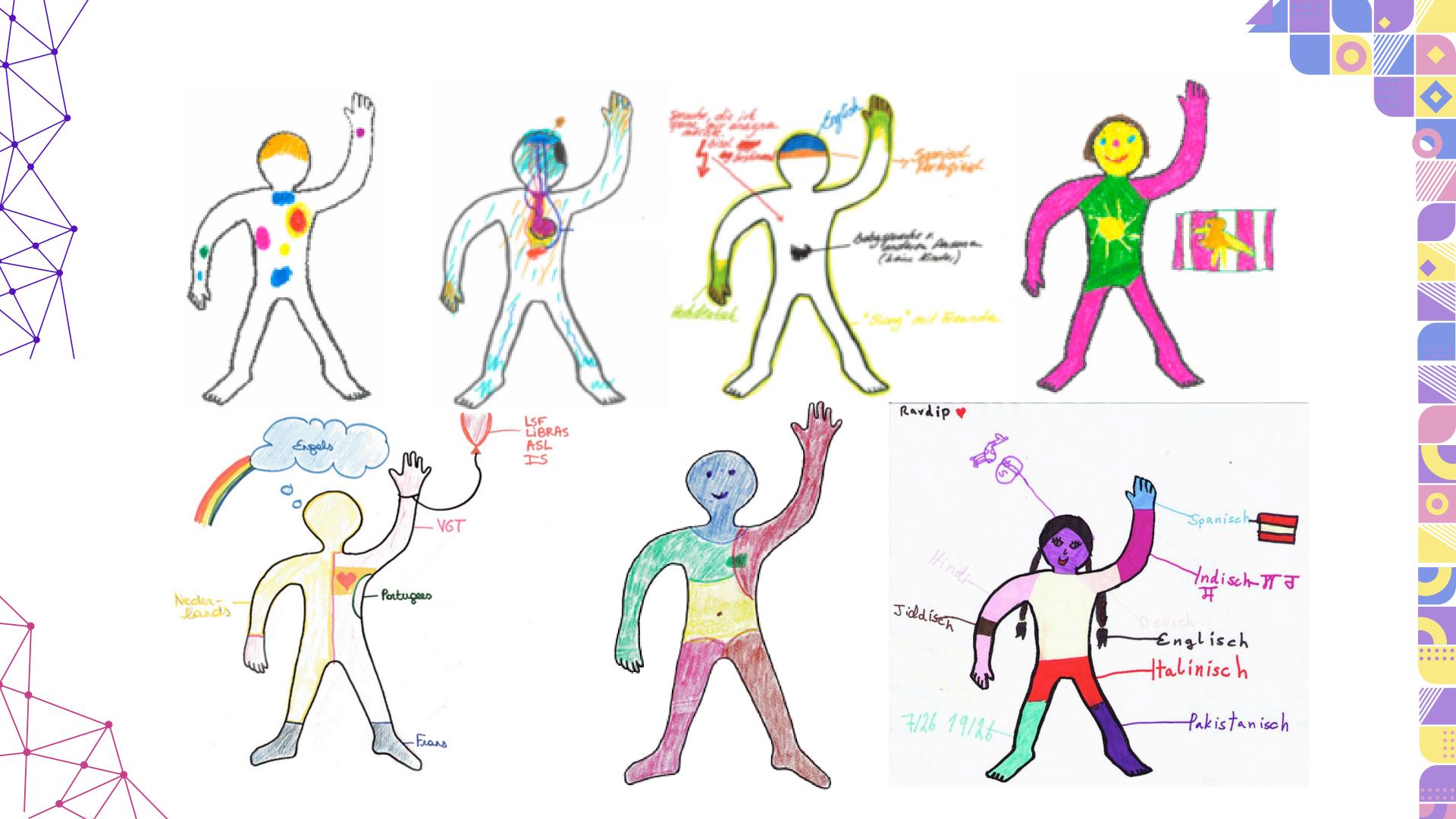

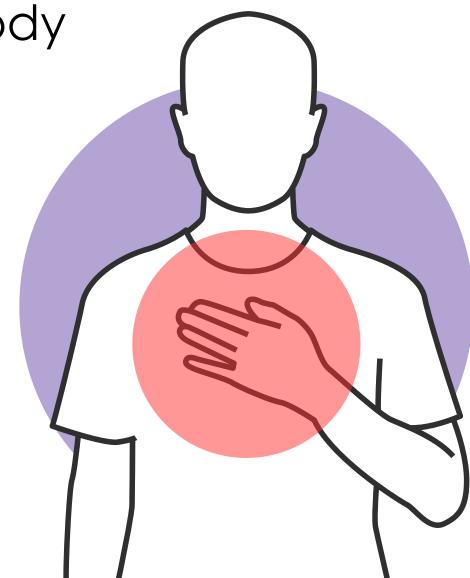




WHY IS IT POWERFUL?

- -Language is more than grammar it's identity
- -Multilingual people often live in many "language worlds"
- -The portrait helps you reflect, discover, and share:
 - Where your languages are "felt" in the body
 - What languages mean to you
 - Which situations you use them in

Your head, heart, and hands may speak different languages!



WHERE IS IT USED?

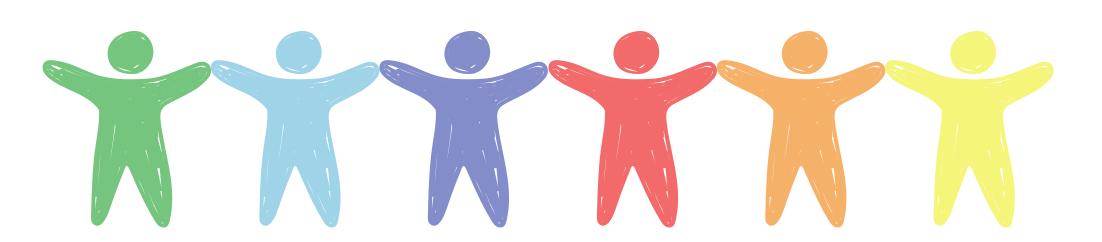
- Schools and universities

- Community work

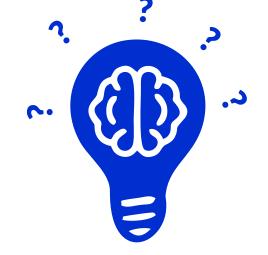
Always to raise awareness of how people experience and carry their languages



HOW TO DO IT - THE BASICS

- 1. Get your body silhouette (paper or digital).
- 2. Think about the languages in your life.
- 3. Choose colors for each language.
- 4. Mark where you "feel" each one. (e.g., Spanish in the heart, German in the hands, Arabic in the ears)
- 5. Add symbols, words, or drawings if you like.
 - There is no "right" or "wrong" way!





REFLECTING ON IT

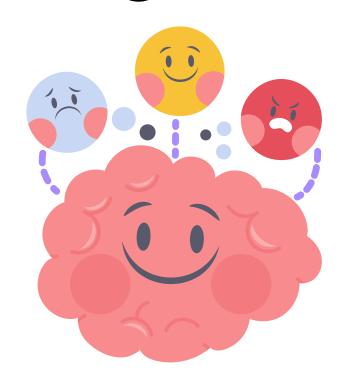
Ask yourself:

- How did it feel to do this?
- What surprised you?
- Are there "invisible" languages in your story?
- Where do you feel proud/ confused/ powerful?
- → Language is not just spoken it's lived.



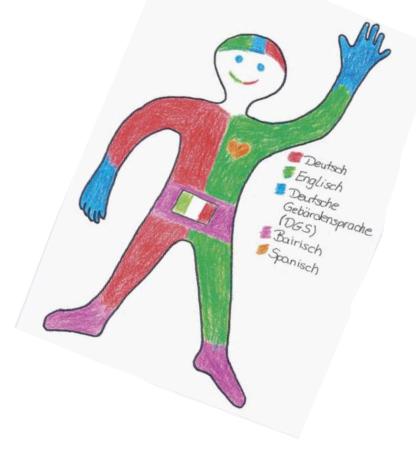
USING IT WITH OTHERS

- In your job (e.g. with students, clients, children)
- With your family or friends
- In team-building or training sessions
- As a personal reflection tool
- Use it to talk about diversity, belonging, identity, and inclusion
- It opens doors to stories that language tests never show!

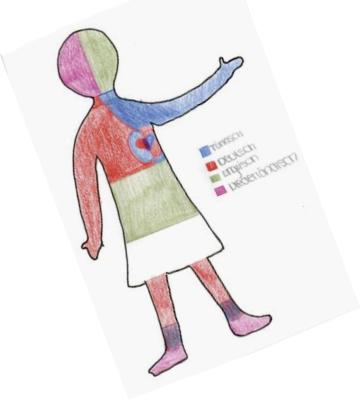


REAL-LIFE EXAMPLES

- Teacher in the UK uses it to understand students' emotional connections to language
- ✓ NGO in South Africa uses it to explore mixed-language identities
- Psychologists use it to support migrant youth processing trauma
- ✓ iLanguage uses it for Erasmus+ trainings like this one! ☺️







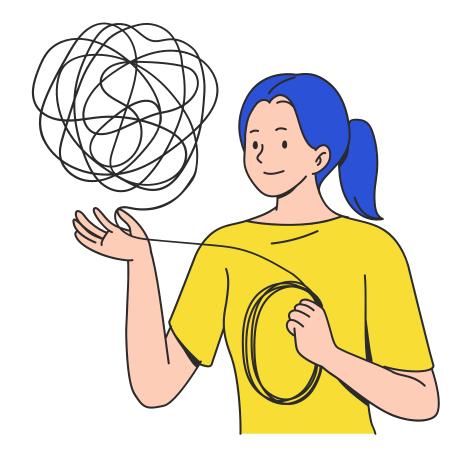
TIPS FOR LEADING A LANGUAGE PORTRAIT ACTIVITY

- Create a safe, open space
- Offer plenty of materials (colors, extra paper, markers)
- Give enough time
- Listen without judging
- Let people share if they want
- Emphasize that all languages count home
 languages, street languages, signs, music, emojis!



LANGUAGE PORTRAITS AND YOUR LIFE

- Helps you reflect on your language journey
- Makes your invisible language experiences visible
- Helps you connect with others through language stories
- Can be a practical tool in education, work, and community
- It's not just art it's identity, resilience, and multilingual awareness

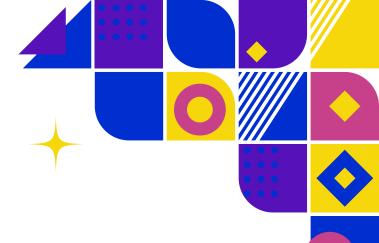
- You'll get your own silhouette
