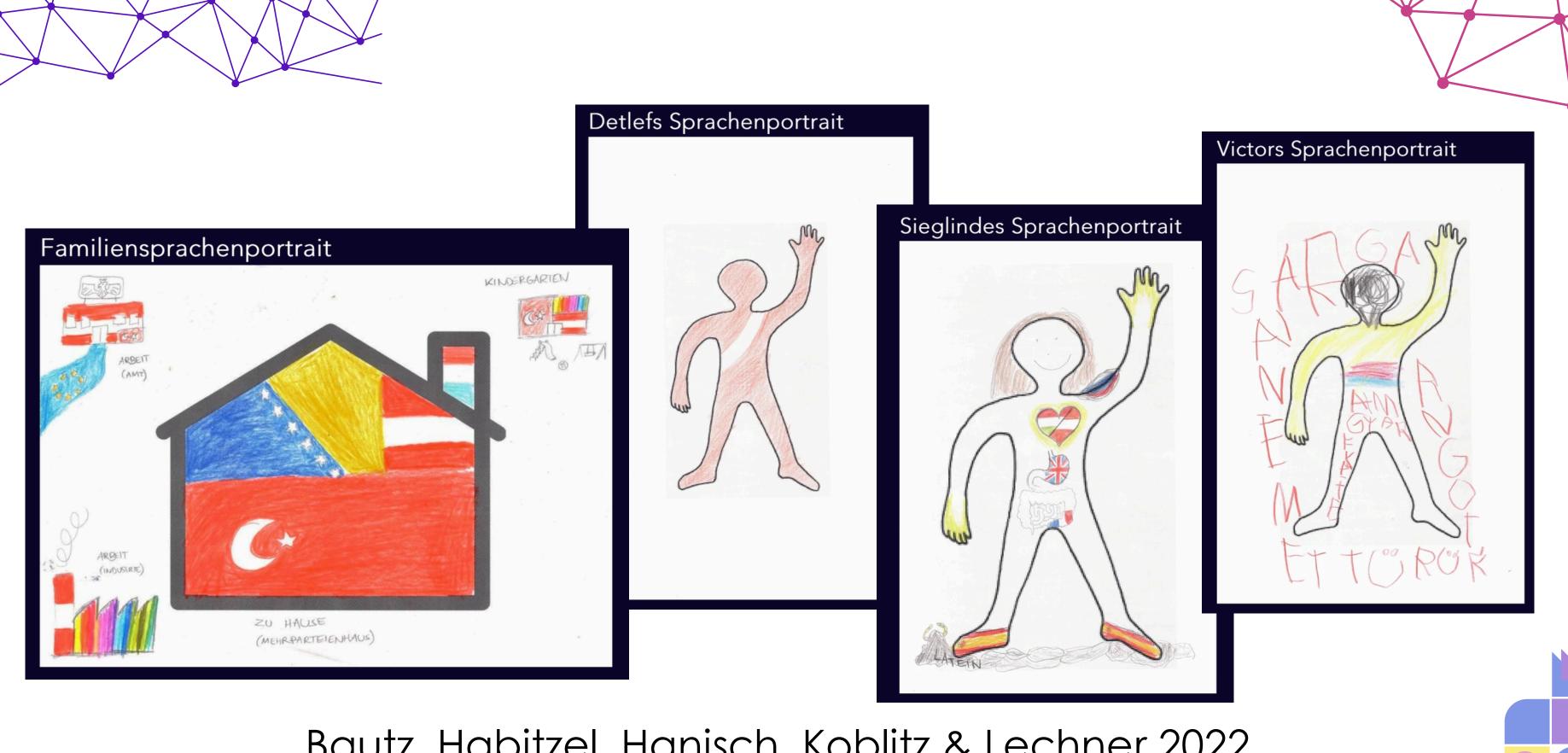

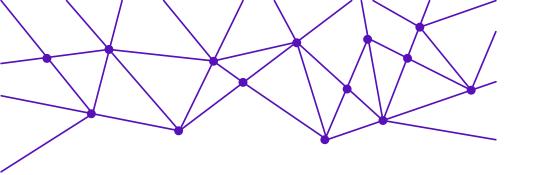




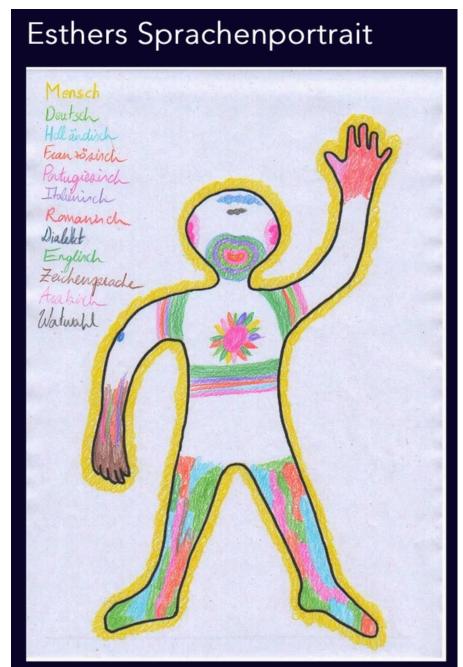
LLS was used for the first time in the winter semester 2022 as part of a seminar on minority research at the University of Vienna.

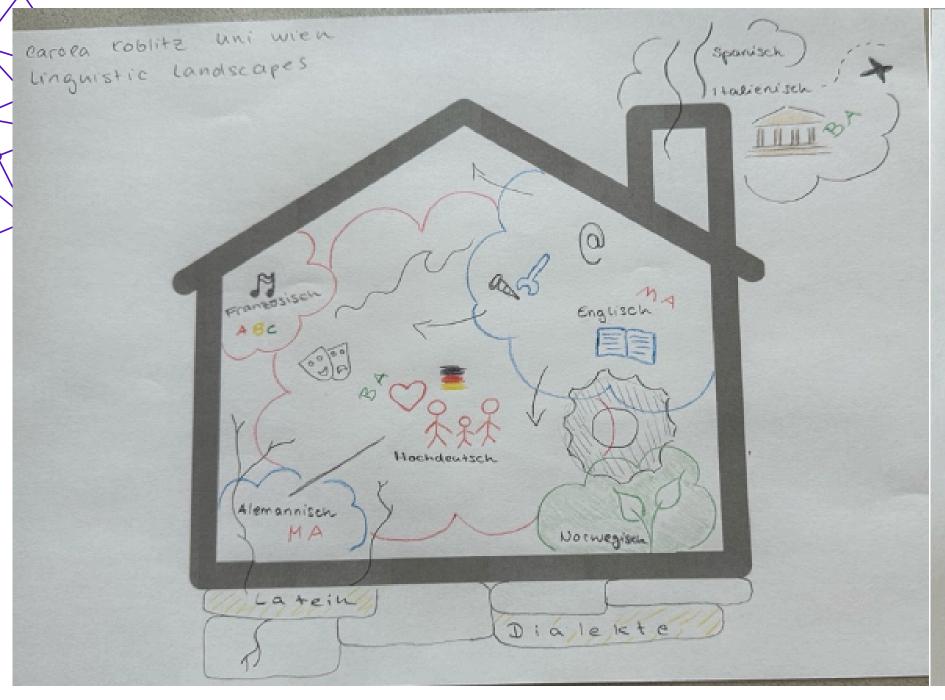


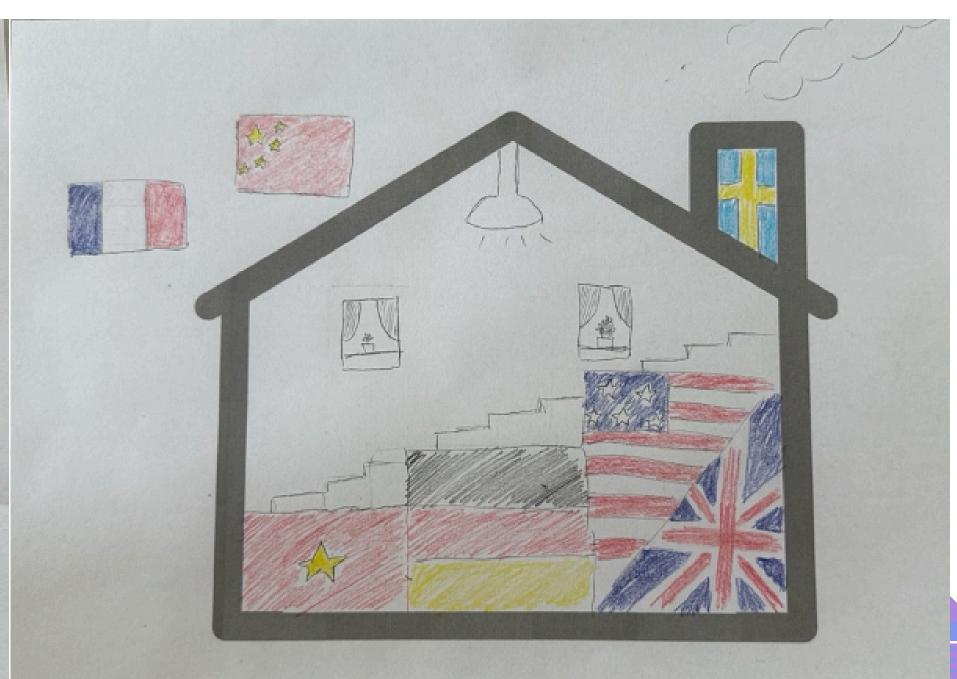

DEVELOPMENT

Based on the findings from the previous sessions and a seminar by Brigitta Busch, it was determined that the lines of the house were too thick and that not all people associate a house directly with a "living space".

That's why, as part of CALA*, I tried to give the participants a blank sheet of paper.

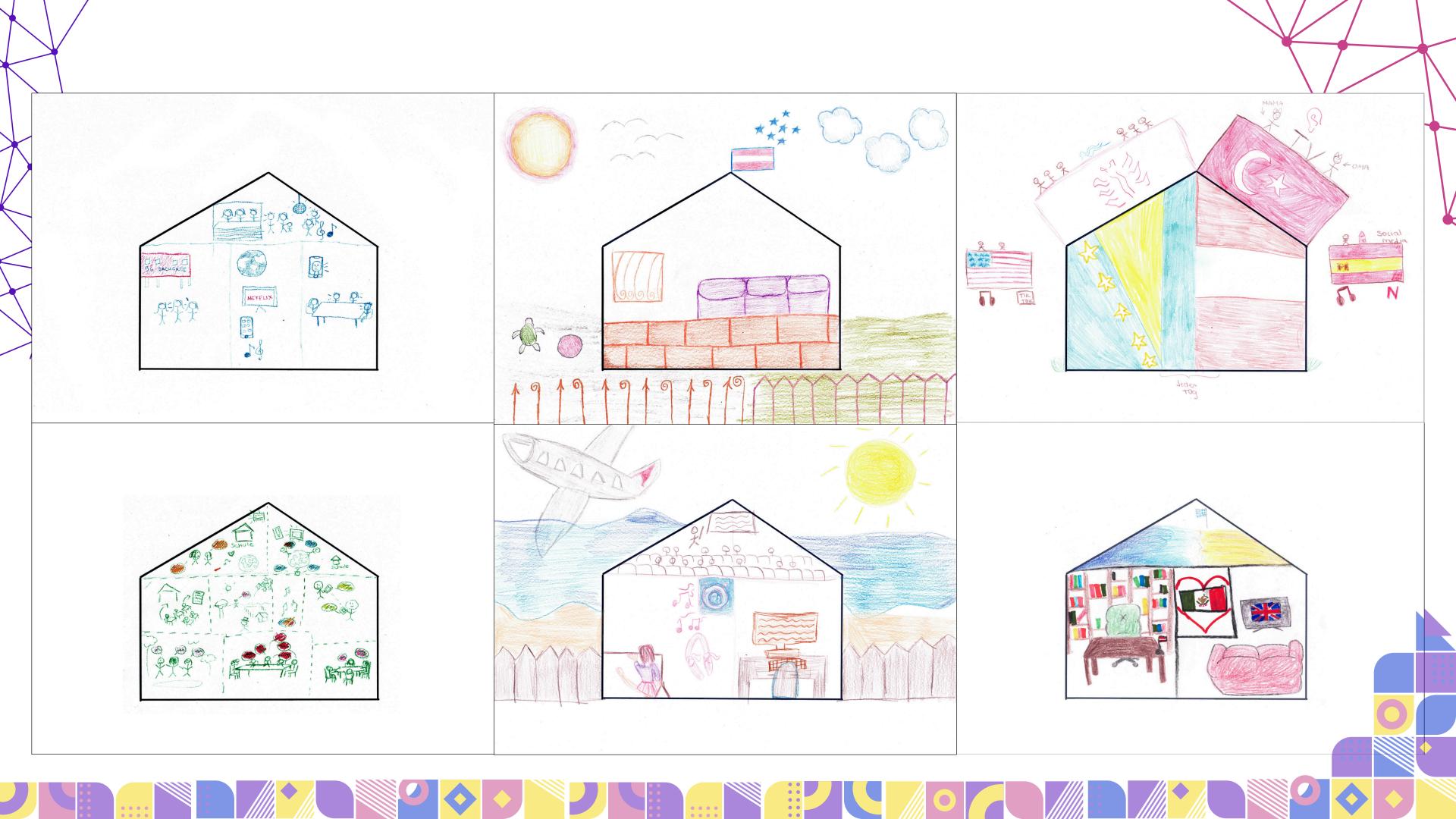
With the advice and support of Brigita Busch and art therapist Linda Velázquez Ramos, the search for the right silhouette began...



Thanks to the collaboration with the art therapist, I learned how sensitization works before such an exercise. I learned what steps to take. It is especially important to insist that there are no right or wrong answers or actions. We are all artists, which means it is a purely creative process.

A good prompt or introduction to a creative session should include the following:

- Reflections on the languages spoken.
- When, where and how they were learned.
- With whom and where (under what circumstances) they are spoken.
- It should be reflected that abstract spaces such as the internet or art/sport etc. can also be included.
- It should be emphasized that there are no right or wrong answers.
- If it is a group session, exchange should be encouraged.
