COGNITION

MOTOR

COGNITIVE DEVELOPMENT 在臣

- Looks for hidden or partially covered toys (shows early problem-solving)
- Transfers objects from one hand to the other
- □ Explores objects by shaking, banging, or mouthing them
- □ Watches things fall and tries to repeat the action

PEECH AND LANGUAGE

- Responds to own name
- Understands simple words like "no" or "bye-bye"
- Babbles with different sounds: "ba-ba," "da-da," "ma-ma"
- Imitates sounds or gestures (like waving or clapping)

GROSS MOTOR SKILLS

- Sits without support
- Rolls over both ways
- Crawls or starts creeping on hands and knees
- Pulls up to stand
- May start cruising (walking holding furniture)

FINE MOTOR SKILLS

- Picks up small things with thumb and finger (pincer grasp)
- Passes objects between hands smoothly
- Bangs two objects together
 - Tries to feed self using fingers

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SOCIAL

SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT

- Shows preference for familiar people and may be shy with strangers
- Enjoys peek-a-boo or simple games
- Cries when parent leaves (separation anxiety begins)
- Expresses different emotions clearly—joy, anger, fear

Talk to your pediatrician if your baby:

- Doesn't sit without support by 9–10 months
- Doesn't babble (like "ba-ba" or "da-da")
- Doesn't respond to their name
- Doesn't show interest in people or games
- Doesn't look where you point or follow gestures
- Doesn't try to move (roll, crawl, or stand)
- Has difficulty using hands equally or doesn't pick up small things

Early support can help your child thrive. Trust your instincts—if something feels off, it's okay to ask for help.
