Milestones Checkist

COGNITIVE DEVELOPMENT

- Looks at toys with interest
- iglacksquare Reaches out to explore things
- igla Watches faces and follows objects side to side
- \blacksquare Shows curiosity by staring, grabbing, or mouthing things

🗣 SPEECH AND LANGUAGE

- Makes more cooing and babbling sounds (like "ah," "goo," "ba")
- Responds to your voice by turning head or smiling
- Starts to copy some sounds you make
- Expresses happiness or discomfort through different cries

💪 GROSS MOTOR SKILLS

- Holds head steady without support
- Pushes up on elbows during tummy time
- Rolls over from tummy to back or back to tummy
- 🛑 🔲 Sits with some support (like pillows or your hands)

🕨 FINE MOTOR SKILLS

- 📄 🔲 Reaches out for toys or your face
- 📔 🔲 Grasps and shakes small toys or rattles
- Brings hands together and explores them
 - Begins to pass toys from one hand to the other

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SOCIAL AND EMOTIONAL DEVELOPMENT

- Smiles easily at familiar faces
- Enjoys playing with you or caregivers
- 🛛 🗌 Responds to your emotions—may cry when you're upset
- Laughs out loud and squeals with joy

Talk to your pediatrician if your baby:

- Doesn't smile or show interest in people by 5–6 months
- Can't hold head steady while sitting
- Doesn't reach for or grasp objects
- Doesn't make any sounds or cooing
- Seems unusually stiff or floppy
- Doesn't follow objects with eyes
- Doesn't respond to sounds or voices

These signs don't always mean something is wrong—but getting help early can really support your child's growth.
