

Top 10 Mistakes to Avoid in Resin Art

A Beginner's Survival Guide to Flawless Results

Starting with resin is exciting, but it's also unforgiving. A single wrong move can leave you with sticky disasters, cloudy pours, or wasted supplies. 1. Using the Wrong Resin for Your Project

The fix: Work in a room between 70–75°F (21–24°C). Warm bottles gently before mixing if your space is chilly.

5. Ignoring Safety

The mistake: Bare hands, no mask, no ventilation. Resin can irritate skin and lungs.

The fix: Wear nitrile gloves, use a respirator, and ventilate your space. Safety gear is not optional—it's professional.

6. Overheating with a Torch or Heat Gun

The mistake: Burning resin while chasing bubbles. Overheating causes yellowing, smoke, or cracks.

The fix: Use short passes with a heat gun. Don't hold it in one spot. For small molds, a toothpick often works better than heat.

7. Moving Projects Too Soon

The mistake: Touching, tilting, or demolding within 12–24 hours. Resin may look cured but isn't.

The fix: Follow cure times. Most resins need 24–72 hours for full strength. When in doubt, wait longer.

8. Skipping Mold Prep and Care

The mistake: Using dusty, oily, or baking molds. The result? Dull, stuck, or warped pieces.

The fix: Invest in resin-grade silicone molds. Clean them gently, dry fully, and use mold release spray for tricky shapes.

9. Overloading with Add-Ins

The mistake: Stuffing too many flowers, stones, or glitters. Resin can't cure around trapped air or bulk.

The fix: Less is more. Keep inclusions thin, flat, and fully dried. Seal flowers with Mod Podge before embedding.

10. Giving Up Too Soon

The mistake: One bad pour leads to abandoning resin altogether.

The fix: Every mistake teaches you something. Keep experimenting, learn the science, and use guides like this one to improve.
