To celebrate the start of the new Rotary Year, all Rotaract Clubs and Councils under RI District 3860 are encouraged to initiate a child-centered community outreach program at a Barangay Day Care Center or any community-identified safe venue. This project highlights our commitment to nurturing young lives while renewing our Rotaract energy for another impactful year.

#### **Proposed Timeline:**

• July 1–15, 2025 (Clubs may implement anytime within this window)

#### Suggested Activities (Flexible based on club capacity and venue):

- 1. Welcome & New Year Party for Kids
  - o Storytelling, dancing, snacks, and games
- 1. Early Childhood Learning Sessions
  - o Mini-workshops on hygiene, manners, ABCs, colors, etc.
- 2. Art for Hope: Painting or Coloring Activity
  - o Kids create drawings or cards symbolizing their dreams
- 3. Health & Nutrition Caravan
  - o Feeding program, vitamins, health teaching (handwashing, toothbrushing)
- 4. Gift-Giving
  - School kits, hygiene kits, toys, or food packs
- 5. Pledge Wall with Kids
  - o Rotaractors and kids write/draw their dreams for the year
- 6. Mini Talent Show or Costume Parade
  - o Empowering children to perform and showcase talents
- 7. Book or Toy Donation Drive
  - o Each club donates a mini-library or toy set to the center

### **Documentation Requirements (to be submitted to District):**

- 1. FB Page Posting of the Project with caption and proper tagging
- 2. Video Clips:
  - o Minimum of 3 video clips per Council
  - o Each clip should be at least 30 seconds long
  - o Content: activity highlight, message from a Rotaractor, children's response
- 3. Photos:
  - o Minimum of 3 action photos that meet People of Action standards
  - o Capture interaction, emotion, and community impact

## **District-Level Media Output:**

- Video Compilation: Featuring all submitted videos from councils
- Photo Album: "People of Action" album highlighting each council
- To be posted on the District Facebook Page

## **Key Performance Indicators (KPIs)**

• To ensure that the project impact is **measurable and reportable**, all participating Rotaract Clubs and Councils are required to track and submit the following **Key Performance Indicators (KPIs)** as part of their post-activity documentation:

#### 1. Number of Children Reached

- a. This refers to the **total number of children who directly benefited** from the activity.
- b. May include children who:
  - i. Participated in games, storytelling, or workshops
  - ii. Received educational, hygiene, or food kits
  - iii. Attended learning sessions or talent shows
- c. **Purpose**: Measures the community impact and the scope of beneficiaries served.
- d. How to Report: Provide the total headcount and briefly describe the activities done with the children.
- e. Example: "A total of 75 children from Barangay Calamba attended the event and participated in a storytelling session, art activity, and feeding program."

#### 2. Number of Rotaractors Mobilized

- a. This refers to the **total number of Rotaractors who actively participated** in planning, preparation, and actual implementation of the activity.
- b. Includes members involved in:
  - i. Pre-event planning and coordination
  - ii. On-site facilitation and hosting
  - iii. Kit preparation, logistics, and documentation

- c. **Purpose**: Measures member engagement and the strength of club or council mobilization.
- d. **How to Report**: Indicate the number of members and their general roles.
- e. Example: "12 Rotaractors from RAC Cebu were mobilized to facilitate the activity, handle games, and distribute educational kits."

### 3. Total Volunteer Hours Rendered

- a. This refers to the **cumulative number of hours contributed by all Rotaractors** involved in the project.
- b. Should include time spent on:
  - i. Meetings and coordination
  - ii. Preparation and packing
  - iii. Actual program duration (including travel time, if applicable)
- c. How to Calculate:
- d. Multiply the number of Rotaractors by their approximate total hours of involvement.
- e. **Purpose**: Captures the extent of time and effort invested into the project, which supports Rotary's global service metrics.
- f. Example: "With 10 Rotaractors each contributing 5 hours, the total volunteer hours rendered was 50"

## 4. Optional Indicators (Encouraged for Comprehensive Reporting)

- a. These are not required but highly encouraged for a deeper understanding of impact:
  - i. Number of Partner Organizations/Barangays Involved
  - ii. Number of Donated Kits/Items Distributed
  - iii. Community Leaders Engaged or Present
