S pirtual Motherhood

As I kneel here at 5am in Adoration before the sun rises, my heart is filled with so many thoughts on Spiritual Motherhood.

Mother Theresa told America, 'Give me your unwanted children.' She said, 'The Sisters and I will take them. We will love them.' something endearing about him, a kind of sadness that made me believe he didn't have a friend in the world. I would show him tenderness and kindness and even go out of my way to give him my time or give him something extra.

One day he brought me a clock that was rather dirty, but had a picture of Jesus on it. He may have found it in the trash, but that didn't matter to me, I felt like the Mom who is so very grateful for the bouquet of dandelions her son picked for her! So I cleaned it up, gave it fresh batteries and hung it on the wall

where people coming in could see it. He would look for that clock every time he came to the Mission, and even noticed it had moved one day when sister put it in the food room to replace a broken clock. We promptly put it back where it belonged.



He would seek me out every time he visited us (and still does) and I always do my best, even when inconvenient, to give him that personal touch he needs. I pray daily for my spiritual son, rejoice when things are going well, have compassion when he has a problem and help in any way I can. I love him, and thank God constantly for the great privilege of being his spiritual Mother.

A little girl followed Sister around the mission staring at her. Finally she came up and asked her "Are you Jesus' sister?"

So many of the children and adults - because Spiritual Mothers are not limited by the age of their "adopted" children – are broken from past hurts or lack of wholesome nurturing. It is a matter of the heart, the hearts of our spiritual children.



Through the Vows we profess to Our Lord of Poverty, Chastity, Obedience and to uphold the Dignity of every human person we understand that it is a Mother's love that opens a heart and allows Our Lord to begin the healing.



We, the Daughters of Mary, learn from Our Heavenly Mother how to carry souls in our hearts and bring them to Christ until they are born into everlasting life.

Over the years, many people of all walks of life have come through our door. There are elderly who just feel alone, like no one cares about them or remembers them. They wait all weekend for us to open so they can come and experience true love.

There are children who have no one waiting for them when they come home from school because their parent or caretaker is always working. There are children who you could probably guess have not been treated according to their great dignity as sons & daughters of God. There are mentally and spiritually handicapped individuals with whom society is not patient. They all come, not just for what they can get materially but because they long to be listened to, appreciated, and loved.

Some of these beautiful souls will always be little children. They teach me to be selfless, which is the primary requisite of truly loving another. Our friends and neighbors need our compassion so they may see the great dignity they have in the Heart of God. They need to know that they too are worthy of love.

Each must do their part with the gifts/talents God has given to them.

At a recent financial transaction, the accountant asked what my profession was.

When I told her how long I have been a Nurse Practitioner, her answer came back quickly, "Well, you make a lot of money." The Christian couple I was with drew a breath and exchanged looks. I said, "I have been a Nurse Practitioner volunteer for the past 9 years at the Rose Garden Home Mission.

Her look was one of utter disbelief as she said, "Why would you do that?"

It's not the first time I have been asked that question. Perhaps this question was due to

putting money over God and relationship. Perhaps she never experienced the joy of just giving from the heart the gifts you have been given.

So, why do I do I volunteer at the Rose Garden Center for Hope and Healing? The world needs Hope - Hope based in love of God and neighbor. This world, most especially, needs Healing. Healing of body, and of spirit.

We recently lost a patient who had multiple serious medical problems. Bob came in weekly, sometimes just to sit in the waiting room and talk with us, sometimes to come to the exam room and talk about different things in his life. I asked him once about God and belief. His Christianity came

pouring forth in a gentle and humble way, talking about his nightly prayer and making sure he (on a very limited budget) had been able to help someone that day.





Another patient who has a cardiac stent brought his brother in to be seen. His brother had a recent cardiac arrest and has no insurance. Both need expensive medication which we were able to provide through a national non-profit.

What happens when you have no insurance and live on \$753.00 monthly? Rents in our neighborhood average \$500.00. People come to "The Sisters" for baby items, food and other practical items. They come to the clinics for medicine and treatment.

Not only do patients receive Hope and Healing, but this applies to volunteer staff also – myself included.

How does it feel to see tears of happiness when we sing happy birthday and give a sweet treat to

our patient? How does it feel for a patient to hug and thank you for being their medical provider? What do you think?

Why would I work for free? Why not?!

A nurse mentioned one Tues. that our self-inflating blood pressure cuff just stopped working and it was hard to pump the manual cuff all day long for Healthy Tues. The next week we were donated a self-inflating blood pressure cuff out of the blue just before we opened for Healthy Tues. God providing for His people!




