pear Friends, Summer is upon us again! Summer brings so much joy, so many fond memories and many things to look forward to for most of us. Family vacations, cold lemonade, patriotic parades, backyard adventures and so forth. Summer also brings with it HEAT. It is typical for the temperature to rise to the upper 90's here in Kentucky, often for days on end!

This presents such a problem in finding modest clothing. Our culture today tells us that we are only as good as we look- and after all, it's hot outside! It particularly targets women, telling them that if they don't wear trendy, revealing clothing, they will be rejected and shunned. Short Shorts, Tank tops, Leggings and Jeggings are everywhere. Most women don't even realize they are at risk of being objectified by men.



Have you ever wondered why modesty is important? A false opinion would tell you that our bodies are just occasions of sin for others, and that's why we have to cover them up. That's not it at all! Our bodies are *So Good* Scripture refers to them as temples of the Holy Spirit.

The Body has even been referred to as "The sacrament of the Person." Now, A Sacrament (upper case S) is "a visible sign of an invisible reality instituted by Christ to impart grace." But in a similar way, the human body makes visible the invisible reality of the human person. This gives us a deep insight into why modesty is so important. For example, If someone looks at the Blessed Sacrament and just thinks of eating bread, we know as Catholics that this is wrong. It is wrong because they are not seeing deep enough. They are not recognizing that this is a Person! This is Jesus Christ!



This is one of the many examples of why the Church takes such care to reserve the Blessed Sacrament in utmost dignity and respect. Our Blessed Lord is only exposed at certain times and in certain ways so that we—the Church, His Bride- will not forget His Dignity, so that we will not just see bread but learn to recognize Jesus in disguise.

And in a similar way we know that a man who looks at a woman and just thinks of sexual pleasure is wrong. She is so much more. She is a person who deserves love and respect because of who she is as a daughter of the Most High, a daughter of the King. It can also happen that a woman might look at a man and only think of sexual pleasure or some emotional high. The same applies. This is wrong because he is a person who deserves love and respect because of who he is as a son of the Most High, a son of the King.

This calls to mind one of St. John Paul II's most mind boggling statements, "The problem with Pomography isn't that it shows too much, it is because it shows too little!" Think about it. Pomography

stops at the surface. It shows the outward appearance and ignores the fact that this is a Person who is willed and loved by God, a child of God who is not to be treated or used as an object!

And so you can see that by dressing modestly, you are upholding (and protecting) your own dignity. We are sons and daughters of God and we are to be treated as such.

At this point some of us may feel uneasy. Because of what we have done or things that have been done to us, we do not feel worthy to be thought of as a beloved child of God, or to be treated with that kind of respect. This is extremely common, especially among women, and this is where our culture steps in and whispers, "Did God really say *That?* No, If you do *this*, if you wear *this*, then you will be lovable."

Doesn't this remind you of the serpent's words to Eve? Let us never forget that the devil's original lie to Eve implied that God didn't really love her and was keeping something from her. And if God didn't love her, that meant no one would love her unless she tried to become someone else.

That lie has echoed down through the centuries in the hearts of all Eve's children and all of us, at one time or another, have tasted that most bitter fruit!

Please do not partake of that fruit any longer!

You must believe the truth—the truth that YOU are wanted and loved by God and that HE, Your Father, is greatly offended when others do not respect the child He loves so much! This dignity brings such peace and joy when we fully accept it. This dignity comes with responsibility, but also opens our capacity to receive and to give True Love, not just momentary pleasure.

With all this in mind, we would like to remind our volunteers to please dress modestly when you come to help us at the Rose Garden. On one of the center pages of this newsletter you will find guidelines for proper attire. We would also like to make special mention that tight fitting clothing, such as leggings and jeggin's, are just as revealing as short-shorts. Few woman realize this.





We are not requiring more than what we ourselves practice. The sisters and volunteers go to great lengths to make sure the clothing we are giving to our neighbors is modest. If something is donated that does not uphold a person's dignity, we will try to modify it to make it modest.

If it is not possible for us to do so, we will repurpose or recycle it, but we

will not give it our neighbors. We also require that our neighbors who come to us for help wear respectful clothing that upholds their dignity and that of others. Everyone - men and women alike - who come to us dressed improperly is offered something to wear over their own clothing. They can even take it home if they like it! If they refuse to wear it, they are asked to leave.

To ensure even the Barbie dolls are we give away are dressed modestly, one of the sisters has a ministry to make beautiful dresses, including wedding dresses for them!

Dressing modestly is such an important issue to the Sisters because we take a fourth vow to uphold the dignity of every human person from the moment of conception to natural death. Since modesty helps to uphold and protect human dignity, it has become a real priority for us.

Dear friends and beloved volunteers, we ask that you not be offended if you are offered something to wear while at the mission, we understand how difficult it is these days to find proper clothing that upholds your dignity. We just love you so much that we have made it a priority so to ensure that your dignity to be upheld, too!

The Rose Garden Home Mission received about 41,512 Total Visits in 2022. This number includes visits for food and for baby items.

There are about 833 Moms and Guardians whom we currently serve, who visited our Mission about 7,024 times last year. We have about 2,054 children registered with us. In serving these families last year, We gave away 10,172 packs of diapers, 8,421 packs of wipes, 450 cans of formula, 240 Baby Welcome Baskets, 114 Pack n Plays, 269 Car seats, and 147





We have some other exciting news to share! One of our long time neighbors -and dear friend- was just received into the Catholic Church! Melody had been visiting the Rose Garden for many years, but the last few years have been especially difficult for her. Witnessing the Love and care of the Sisters and Volunteers at the Rose Garden, she was inspired to learn more about where that love came from—their relationship

with Jesus Christ through the Catholic Faith.

On November 22, 2022 we gave away about 460 Thanksgiving meals to families in need. Each family received a Turkey and 5 bags of "Fixin's" including both perishable and non-perishable sides and condiments.

On December 20, 2022, we saw about 300 families for Christmas Help. Each Family received a Ham or Turkey, along with a sack of toys for each child. We totaled around 862 children this year!



2022 Medical Clinic Statistics

This year our Clinic received a total of 653 visits. We saw 219 individual patients from all walks of life —one month old to 83 years old! We supplied 51 eye exams, 25 pairs of glasses and 17 mammograms. Many of our patients are diabetics, whom we provided with about 150 diabetes supplies and medications.






Dental clinic statistics


