


## TANZANIA

### **BEST TIME OF YEAR**

#### January to March: The Calving Season

Traveling to Tanzania is an exciting adventure, and being prepared with practical knowledge will make your trip smooth and enjoyable. From understanding currency to navigating local transport, here's what you need to know:

#### **Currency and Money**

- Currency: The Tanzanian Shilling (TZS) is the local currency. U.S. dollars are widely accepted for major expenses like accommodation and tours, but small purchases require shillings.
- Banks and ATMs: ATMs are available in major cities like Arusha, Dar es Salaam, and Zanzibar. Many accept Visa and MasterCard. Always carry cash when visiting remote areas, as ATMs may be scarce.
- Tipping: Tipping is customary for guides, drivers, and lodge staff. A general guideline is \$10-20 per day for guides and \$1-5 per day for porters or lodge staff.

#### **Plugs and Chargers**

- Plug Type: Tanzania uses Type D and Type G plugs, with a standard voltage of 230V and frequency of 50Hz.
- Adapters: Bring a universal travel adapter to charge devices.
- Power Outages: Power cuts are common, especially in remote areas. Carry a power bank to keep your devices charged.

#### Language

- Official Languages: Swahili and English are widely spoken. English is commonly used in hotels, lodges, and with tour guides.
- Key Swahili Phrases:
  - Jambo: Hello
  - Asante: Thank you
  - Karibu: Welcome
  - Pole pole: Slowly (often used in a relaxed or friendly context)
  - Hakuna matata: No worries

Learning a few words in Swahili will delight locals and enhance your experience.

  may vary, especially in remote areas. Consider purchasing a local SIM card
  for better connectivity.
- Water: Drink bottled or filtered water to avoid illness. Most lodges provide safe drinking water.

#### Safety and Health

- Vaccines: No mandatory vaccines are required, though yellow fever vaccination is recommended if traveling from a yellow fever zone.
- Insect Protection: Use insect repellent and wear long sleeves in the evening to avoid mosquito bites.
- Travel Insurance: Comprehensive travel insurance is a must.

#### **Shopping and Souvenirs**

- Local Markets: Look for handmade crafts, Maasai jewelry, and Tanzanite gemstones. Bargaining is expected but always done with a smile.
