



History of Rio de Janeiro

Rio de Janeiro, fondly known as Cidade Maravilhosa (The Marvelous City), boasts a rich history shaped by Indigenous, African, and European influences. Rio was home to the Tupi people, one of Brazil's largest Indigenous groups cultivating the land, communities, & fished along the coast, inspiring the naming of sites like Tijuca National Park, and the Corcovado Mountain.

African Contributions

With the arrival of enslaved Africans during the 16th century, The vibrant rhythms of samba and capoeira, a martial art disguised as dance, emerged from this cultural exchange. African religious practices, particularly Candomblé, blended with Catholicism to form unique rituals and festivals. Today, Rio's Little Africa (Pequena África) in the Saúde district stand as a testament to the enduring legacy of African communities.

LGBT+ Community

Brazil has a rich and complex LGBTQ+ history, they legalized same-sex marriage in 2013 & have a vibrant Pride celebration, particularly in São Paulo.

Community and Cultural Fusion

From the colonial-era buildings of downtown Rio to the Afro-Brazilian dishes like **feijoada and acarajé**, every corner of the city tells a story of **resilience** and **cultural pride**.

The spirit of community is especially evident during **Carnival and local blocos**, where people come together to celebrate, **making Rio a truly remarkable destination**.



The Evolution of Carnival

It originates from Portuguese colonists- Entrudo, a chaotic, playful celebration involving water fights and feasts before Lent. 19th century, street parades with music and costumes became a hallmark of the festivities. African religions and celebrations: Candomblé and maracatu, inspired the colorful and symbolic elements seen in the parades.



The Samba & Afro-Brazil

The samba, the heartbeat of Carnival, originated from African musical styles, blending them with European instruments and melodies. The introduction of samba music in the 1920s transformed with samba schools organizing elaborate parades and competitions in the Sambadrome.
