DOE DELHI ANNOUNCES WINTER BREAK FROM JAN 1 TO 15!

Delhi government schools will have a winter break from January 1 to 15. Students in classes 9 to 12 must attend mandatory remedial classes during this period. Classes 9 and 11 will focus on English, Science, and Math, while classes 10 and 12 will work on revision and pre-board papers. Remedial classes will be at least one hour long, and attendance is compulsory. Students must wear proper school uniform.

How can schools make remedial classes more effective?

- Identify where each student is struggling and focus on strengthening the basics for individual attention.
- Hold regular training and workshops for teachers to keep them updated on teaching methods.
- Teachers should be patient, empathetic, and understand that not all students are top performers; talking and counselling can help.
- Stay in regular contact with parents through WhatsApp or calls to update them on progress and offer ways to support their child at home.



Delhi govt issues order to tighten admission procedures & verify documents to prevent illegal Bangladeshi migrant enrolment

On December 23, the Delhi government's Directorate of Education issued an order requiring schools to thoroughly verify the documents of migrant children during admissions to prevent the enrolment of illegal Bangladeshi migrants.

Surge in Nursery Admissions as "Parents Prioritize Early Education"



- Nursery admissions for the 2025-26 academic session in around 1,741 private schools in Delhi concluded on Friday, December 20.
- The first general admission lists will be published on January 17, 2025.
- The second list of selected students, along with the marks allotted, will be released on February 3, 2025. Subsequent admission lists, if any, will be published on February 26, 2025.
- The admission process, including parent visits for queries and marks allotment, will conclude on February 14, 2025.
- Delhi Nursery Admissions for 2025-26 see significant rise compared to last year.

Private schools are required to reserve 25 per cent of their seats for students from the Economically Weaker Section (EWS), Disadvantaged Groups (DG), and children with disabilities.
