

THE 2025 SESSION



Changing the World

One of the express goals of God's Kingdom-building is to change the world. And it's not just to get things back to factory settings, their original working order. If the Book of Revelation is any guide, we're shooting for something new—albeit, recognizable, but new.

And trying to take in everything that's going on, it all feels too big, overwhelming. Food/water insecurity is a scourge and a by-product of human greed. Food/water insecurity should not exist: because there's more than enough to go around. But how do we really end hunger? Political strife has been with us since the Garden and political violence since the first children even though God provided everything they needed. Political strife and violence should not exist. But how do we address politics in real ways and in ways consistent with God's will? Our human habits can be bad to just plain evil: isolation, envy, lust, selfishness, willfulness, stubbornness. We aren't just bulls in the china shop, we sometimes knock down the entire block of stores.

As I watched the meeting in the oval office between our President and others and the President of Ukraine, I found myself realizing in the exchange a shift in our world politics. My heart was full of questions about what comes next and whether anything I do really has any impact. Whether my faith really matters.

I believe that may at least be part of why someone asked me if these are the "End Times." They asked whether the players, even President Trump himself, might be the AntiChrist or harbingers of the Apocalypse. Whether the events in the Middle East, especially with Israel, are signaling the end of history as we know it. With all due respect to my colleagues and theologians in many parts of the world (and history), Jesus' very plain command is helpful: be ready.

It's not that the questions don't matter. Of course they do. But what matters more is what we're studying this season of Lent: the life of a disciple. What matters is that we are trying to live that disciple-kind of life. If we're doing that, y'all, it simply doesn't matter WHEN the Apocalypse happens: we'll be ready. What can we really know about the End Times? Nothing. No one knows, Jesus says. What we DO know is that the Kingdom of Heaven is at hand. It's here. It's now.

So how do I answer the problem of world hunger? I feed whom I can. How do I deal with the politics of my day? I act in my capacity as a citizen: serve where I can, speak up when necessary and love my neighbors. I address the ills of this world by making shalom—everything being set right—my personal mission. All of this in service to changing the world by paying attention to the one thing I truly can change: myself. God is changing me. And as that transformation happens, the world changes: what I see, what I hear, what I feel, what I know, what I do.

And so, this season of Lent and beyond, allow God to change the world by making room for God to truly change you. Open yourself, really open yourself, to the idea that there is room for improvement in you, places for growth. Then improve. Then grow. Don't just talk about it. Don't just give up chocolate or social media for a few weeks. Give up whatever is holding you back from a disciple's life and embrace the very grace of God that is transforming you.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

ONE STEP AT A TIME

We all have different paths. While this may be obvious, it becomes apparent that our penchant to judge comes from a place that forgets about that. Though every path is different there is one universal truth: everyone takes their path one step at a time. What are the steps God has placed before you? As you enter into the season of Lent consider the steps you will take this season and even this year. And don't just consider where you might be going. consider who, what, when, where and how you are stepping. What are you teaching others about faith in Christ from the way you are walking your path?

QUESTIONS AS YOU WORSHIP THIS WEEK

As you prepare for Worship, consider the following questions:

- What are the limits on what you can do as a disciple of Jesus Christ?
- What do you have left to learn as a disciple? What are you doing to learn it?
- What could someone learn about being a disciple from observing your life?
- Can building disciples happen at a distance or must you be close?

BUILDING DISCIPLES

Classically, the Gospel of Matthew ends with the charge from Jesus to "make disciples." That we are partners with God in the building of the Kingdom. Our church motto ends with this notion. How in the world do we do that? During the season of Lent, we are exploring that question and the practical application of the Gospel in our lives and for the lives of others.
