READ: 2 Kings 2:1-2, 6-14 (CEB)

Elijah goes to heaven.

¹ Now the LORD was going to take Elijah up to heaven in a windstorm, and Elijah and Elisha were leaving Gilgal. ² Elijah said to Elisha, "Stay here, because the LORD has sent me to Bethel." But Elisha said, "As the LORD lives and as you live, I won't leave you." So they went down to Bethel.

⁶ Elijah said to Elisha, "Stay here, because the LORD has sent me to the Jordan." But Elisha said, "As the LORD lives and as you live, I won't leave you." So both of them went on together.⁷ Fifty members from the group of prophets also went along, but they stood at a distance. Both Elijah and Elisha stood beside the Jordan River.⁸ Elijah then took his coat, rolled it up, and hit the water. Then the water was divided in two! Both of them crossed over on dry ground.⁹ When they had crossed, Elijah said to Elisha, "What do you want me to do for you before l'm taken away from you?" Elisha said, "Let me have twice your spirit." 10 Elijah said, "You've made a difficult request. If you can see me when I'm taken from you, then it will be yours. If you don't see me, it won't happen." ¹¹ They were walking along, talking, when suddenly a fiery chariot and fiery horses appeared and separated the two of them. Then Elijah went to heaven in a windstorm. ¹² Elisha was watching, and he cried out, "Oh, my father, my father! Israel's chariots and its riders!" When he could no longer see him, Elisha took hold of his clothes and ripped them in two. 13 Then Elisha picked up the coat that had fallen from Elijah. He went back and stood beside the banks of the Iordan River. 14 He took the coat that had fallen from Elijah and hit the water. He said, "Where is the LORD, Elijah's God?" And when he hit the water, it divided in two! Then Elisha crossed over.

READ: Mark 10:35-45 (CEB)

Jesus fields the brother's request.

³⁵ James and John, Zebedee's sons, came to lesus and said, "Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask." ³⁶ "What do you want me to do for you?" he asked. 37 They said, "Allow one of us to sit on your right and the other on your left when you enter your glory." 38 Jesus replied, "You don't know what you're asking! Can you drink the cup I drink or receive the baptism I receive?" 39 "We can," they answered. Jesus said, "You will drink the cup I drink and receive the baptism I receive, ⁴⁰ but to sit at my right or left hand isn't mine to give. It belongs to those for whom it has been prepared." ⁴¹ Now when the other ten disciples heard about this, they became angry with James and John.⁴² Jesus called them over and said. "You know that the

ones who are considered the rulers by the Gentiles show off their authority over them and their high-ranking officials order them around. 43 But that's not the way it will be with you. Whoever wants to be great among you will be your servant. 44 Whoever wants to be first among you will be the slave of all, ⁴⁵ for the Human One didn't come to be served but rather to serve and to give his life to liberate many people."


