

Gather these items for worship. If an items unavailable, fret not:

If more than one person will be present, place the table in the middle of where you will be seated. Drape the cloth over it. Arrange the cup, plate, glass of water, and other items on the table. Keep the Bible in front of you. Have enough elements for each person in your household.

Prayer of Confession/Preparation

May we come to reflect your generosity as enthusiastically as we receive it. Thank you for listening, God. Amen.

Presentation of 3rd Grade Bible

- In keeping with the legacy the Reformation provides to us, our congregation provides Bibles to our young folks. This is more than just a token. This is our conviction that actually reading the Bible for yourself and learning to be in conversation with God through it are critical to anyone's faith.
- Also in keeping with our tradition, we are determined that folks have Bibles in their own language, accessible and meaningful. For us, we provide the Common English Bible. Not only is it produced under the latest scholarship, it is also reviewed and edited by the Christian community to be readable and fitting with current idioms.
- And so on behalf of the congregation we present this Bible to Erin Rose Fahey. It is our prayer that as she turns its pages, God's Spirit would turn her heart. We pray that as she reads the texts ancient and far reaching that they would guide her path and allow her imagination to be made bright with God's love, God's hopes and God's joy. May peace govern her steps and may she always find help at home and in her larger community to interpret what she finds in Scripture.

Reading of Scripture

Say: When the temptation and tendency to overcomplicate God's will overtakes us, God's Word is given, accessible and ready. By God's Spirit, it can light up even the darkest recesses of our hearts and minds and show us something new. Let us be open to this gift of God and ask for help to understand. Let us pray...(everyone sings)

²³ Children of Zion, rejoice and be glad in the LORD your God, because he will give you the early rain as a sign of righteousness; he will pour down abundant rain for you, the early and the late rain, as before. ²⁴ The threshing floors will be full of grain; the vats will overflow with new wine and fresh oil. ²⁵ I will repay you for the years that the cutting locust, the swarming locust, the hopping locust, and the devouring locust have eatenmy great army, which I sent against you. ²⁶ You will eat abundantly and be satisfied, and you will praise the name of the LORD your God, who has done wonders for you; and my people will never again be put to shame. ²⁷ You will know that I am in the midst of Israel. and that I am the LORD your God-no other exists; never again will my people be put to shame. ²⁸ After that I will pour out my spirit upon everyone; your sons and your daughters will prophesy, your old men will dream dreams, and your young men will see visions. ²⁹ In those days, I will also pour out my spirit on the male and female slaves. ³⁰ I will give signs in the heavens and on the earthblood and fire and columns of smoke. 31 The sun will be turned to darkness, and the moon to blood before the great and dreadful day of the LORD comes. 32 But everyone who calls on the LORD's name will be saved: for on Mount Zion and in Jerusalem there will be security, as the LORD has promised; and in Jerusalem, the LORD will summon those who survive.

Sermon: "All Hallows Eve"
What precedes the dream can be frightening but is ultimately powerless.

Is fear ALWAYS a bad thing? The King James Version of the Bible frequently refers to the need to "fear the LORD" but that's not an admonition to be afraid of God. It's actually about respecting God and God's proper role. Yet I can think of many instances where fear is useful.

I have a healthy fear of other drivers so I drive "defensively." I live in fear of abject illness and so I get vaccinated. I live in fear of losing my house or having my power and water cut off and so I pay my bills. I fear getting a ticket and so I drive within certain limits. I fear getting arrested for shoplifting and so I pay for my things when I leave a store.

But there are also times that my fears do the exact opposite. Sometimes fear is crippling, debilitating, oppressive. My fear might keep me from trying new things. My fear of being wrong might keep me from apologizing or admitting that I messed up. My fear of not being liked might keep me from taking risks in my relationships or venturing my opinion about something. My fear of what God can do might make me miss what God has actually done.

One of the things that the other gods we might serve have in common is that they all don't care for our well-being. They all don't have our interests at heart. The gods of Mesopotamia or the Greek pantheon or even the gods of our self-interest could really care less if we live or die. They are all wrapped up in serving their own interests and agendas. But the God we serve, the one we believe in, loves us. When we're thinking about whether or not our greed serves us well, remember, whatever we're greedy for has no feelings for us whatsoever. When thinking about fame, that god lies about how very fragile it is. When thinking about lies, we can serve them all we want but they are never satisfied and will betray us at a moment's notice. The god of our pride will not only prevent us from getting the help we need,

pride can even convince us that getting help is a bad thing, an evil thing (even though that's not so). The god of our impatience makes us believe that waiting on the real God is for suckers.

And yet our God is faithful. That means that God can be trusted. Trusted to follow through. Trusted to be with us. Trusted to love us. Trusted with our secrets. Trust God to care enough about us to bother *trying* to discipline us. And most incredibly, God trusts us.

Oh we sing and write and say, "Trust in the Lord." We should, of course. But we tend to think of that in only one direction. We forget that God has demonstrated profound trust with us. We've been entrusted with blessings, with God's secrets, with God's Spirit, with God's grace, with the Gospel, with God's love. God takes a chance loving us because there is no guarantee that we will love God back. None of the other gods we might serve would ever take that risk. God opens God's Self to be hurt by us.

But why are we talking about all of this? Why are we spending time talking about stuff that doesn't sound particularly uplifting. Because it speaks to the passion that God has for us.

Read: Joel 2:23-32 (CEB) God sets out an expansive promise.

The imagery is rich and visceral. Rain for thirsty crops. Vats (not vases) of oil. Eating until you can't eat anymore. No cause for shame. I don't even know what that last image looks like, but I like it. And all of it bookended with the promise of God's own Spirit falling on everyone.

Let's consider for a minute that all of humanity, all of life, bears God's Spirit, the life God intended for us to have, with no strings. We're suddenly immersed in the truth that God's trust with us is a trust God has in God's Self. God believes in what God created us and everything else to be.

But here, God is talking about next level inspiration. People prophesying (speaking for God), the elderly possessing divine dreams, the young having visions. Wow! It goes beyond family

lines, blood, generation, education, lifeexperience, station, economic power, political prowess, athleticism, reputation, persuasiveness, history, fears, desires, and any gods that might try to get in the way. And just to punctuate how widespread this will be, we get verse 29:

"In those days, I will also pour out my spirit on the male and female slaves."

That pretty much covers everybody. It's as beautiful and abundant a promise as we could ever hope to have from God. But then what are supposed to do with what follows?

"I will give signs in the heavens and on the earthblood and fire and columns of smoke. The sun will be turned to darkness, and the moon to blood before the great and dreadful day of the LORD comes."

What in the world?

What are we supposed to do with words like this? Why does any of that have to be part of the promise? Why does their have to be bad stuff at all? Why the suffering? Why the pain? Why does any of the *Day of the LORD* have to be "dreadful"?

Well consider that, for Joel and the people listening to him, the single most important event in their faith history is the Exodus. The plagues were all horrible. And before crossing the Red Sea, the nation was led by a column of smoke during the day and a column of fire by night. They were led by signs of God: things that indicated that, not only God is in charge, but that God is WITH them. God gave Moses signs that showed God had sent him and was with him. The people were given signs that showed God had not forgotten them.

Y'all, that's true for us now, right now. There are signs all around us that God has not forgotten us nor the promise God made to us. There are signs all around us that the nightmare we might feel like we're living through is not the final word on God's dreams for us. What precedes the dream can be frightening but is ultimately powerless. Those gods are ultimately powerless. Thanks be to God.
