
God expects us to be healing.

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

#### **Prayer of Confession/Preparation**

We spend a lot of time and energy on consuming and very little on restoring and healing, especially when it comes to relationships. We need to fix that. It's important to talk about our shortcomings so that we're ready to hear what God has to say. Let us begin with silent prayer...

(Please pray silently...)

Pray: Creator God, every tree, every watering hole, every animal, even the ebbs and flows of the air, you placed at our disposal. And we are doing that. You have given us eyes and ears, voices and hearts and minds to see, hear, know and feel one another: again, all at our disposal. And we are doing that. Help us remember what you actually asked us to do. Help us remember that, for all the encouragement to consume, we are also called to restore. We are called to heal what is torn, bind what is broken, restore what is exhausted. Honestly, God: it all belongs to

God's dreams for what comes.

<sup>21:1</sup> Then I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the former heaven and the former earth had passed away, and the sea was no more. <sup>2</sup> I saw the holy city, New Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, made ready as a bride beautifully dressed for her husband. <sup>3</sup> I heard a loud voice from the throne say, "Look! God's

dwelling is here with humankind. He will dwell with them, and they will be his peoples. God himself will be with them as their God. 4 He will wipe away every tear from their eyes. Death will be no more. There will be no mourning, crying, or pain anymore, for the former things have passed away." <sup>5</sup> Then the one seated on the throne said, "Look! I'm making all things new." He also said, "Write this down, for these words are trustworthy and true." <sup>6</sup> Then he said to me, "All is done. On each side of the river is the tree of life, which produces twelve crops of fruit, bearing its fruit each month. The tree's leaves are for the healing of the nations. <sup>3</sup> There will no longer be any curse. #### Children's Sermon

Adults, you'll need:

- a picture or personal example of a scar (it's better if it's yours)
- Don't forget to wait for answers

"Not Like New"

- I want to show you something...this is a scar. Whenever you get hurt, get a cut, several things happen, right?
- First, it hurts! It doesn't feel good and it makes you want to avoid getting cut again. Sometimes, if the cut is deep enough, it bleeds. That be messy and gross. But did you know that the bleeding helps your cut not to get infected? It's like the blood is pushing the bad germs out.
- But then the blood and skin get together and work on coming back together. They stop the bleeding and you body makes its own bandage! It's called a scar.
- The scar not only helps protect you, but it's also a reminder that you were hurt. But the most important thing a scar does is show you that you can heal. That your body doesn't WANT to stay hurt, but it wants to heal.
- Our faith is like that. We have so many things that can hurt us: a bad word, friends lying, someone dying or getting badly hurt, losing something important. But our faith can give us scars that remind us God wants us to heal.
- So when you're around the people who care about you, be sure and ask them about their scars. Don't be afraid if there are tears.
- Don't forget to pray!

#### Sermon: "Restore Creation"

I remember so well reading the book, **Left Behind.** It was a big piece of midrash based off of an evangelical take on the end times as the authors understood it. It takes as literal the descriptions in the book of Revelation and tries to paint a picture incorporating our present times. It was scary and interesting and over the top. It told the story from the perspectives of those who DIDN'T go up in the rapture. They were, as the title suggests, left behind.

While it was an interesting thought experiment, and I believe the authors were sincere in their hopes that someone would read this and come to a saving knowledge of Jesus Christ, the theology it's based on is wrong.

Revelation is one of those books that often gets leveraged to scare people into faith. It's raised up with books like Daniel and Ezekiel and even some parts of Jesus' words in the Gospels to keep a sense of mystery about what's going to happen and to paint as scary a picture of the consequences of the sinful life AFTER death. Because of how strange it can be, I've seen preachers and theologians (they are NOT always the same) take advantage of folks' desire to do right by God and themselves and make the book say things it doesn't say.

Don't get me wrong: Revelation is a strange book, to be sure. But the clue to God's intention with this body of Scripture is in the name: **Revelation**. God isn't trying to hide things or pull the wool over our eyes. God's *trying* to show us something. And skipping all the way to the end, what does God want us to know about THE end? Not the end times, but where things, where WE end up? Given how everything started, what is to become of Creation? What's to become of us?

# Read: Revelation 21:1-8; 22:1-7 (CEB) God's dreams for what comes.

The last several weeks we've been talking about the **care of Creation.** We've been talking about how to think about it, our responsibilities with it all, God's intentions with us and the world around us. I think it's fair to say that, often, when we talk about our use of resources, our consumption, we presume that we aren't going to be here later. Not only is there a sense that we're going to leave all of this behind someday, we either consciously or subconsciously leave our sense of responsibility behind also.

What does it matter if I use everything up? When we all get to heaven, what's here won't matter. Right? If I eat everything in sight, if I use all the oil in the ground, if I don't pick up after myself, the earth is a secondary concern.

There's just one problem with that mindset. It's not particularly Biblical. It's not Godly.

The passage doesn't say, "I saw a new heaven" and then leave it there. It says "a new heaven AND a new earth." In fact, the word for "heaven" used there is also the word for "sky." A new sky and earth. And what about the sea being no more? Remember, when God's Spirit moved over the watery chaos? Water has always been a symbol of chaos and disorder. When the end comes, chaos comes to an end. Creation becomes what it was supposed to be. And most importantly, God gets what God has always wanted.

#### Immanuel. God with us.

It should give us pause that this is God's dream. It should buoy our spirits and cause us to wonder. How can this possibly be God's dream?

But God's dream is toward the healing of what has been broken. God wants to restore what has been torn. God wants to bind what has been separated. God wants to be with us. And if we want to be with God, that means we need to be with each other. Part of restoring Creation is restoring our relationships. Healing the ways in which we press to separate and figure out why God is so crazy about us.

And as far as the attitude that it's okay to trash everything? To consider stuff, people, even nations, disposable? **God's answer for that is in the leaves.**

Healing of the nations. Y'all, the nations don't just disappear in God's dream. They're still here. And for all of you Bible nerds out there, twelve is the number of governance. Twelve tribes. Twelve disciples. Twelve trees producing their fruit in twelve months the leaves of which heal the nations. Not some nations. THE nations.

Fantastic! Great! Happy to hear it. Glad everything gets sorted out. In fact, God, it can't happen too soon. Make it happen...anytime.

But...then there's verse 7.

I suppose at some point our ability to be spectators was going to end. I mean we started out the Creation story talking about our part in it. We aren't just here to watch. We're here to work. We're supposed to be tilling the earth. Tending. Steering. Caring. Cultivating. Co-creating.

And as a part of the people looking for the coming of Christ, even at the end of the end, we still have a job to do. Keep the words of the prophecy, it says.

Okay. But what does THAT mean?

**First, remember, what does a prophet do?** Speak for God. That's it. And what is a prophecy? Godtalking. When we say there will be a new heaven and a new earth, sure, we're technically telling the future. But saying things like that really means we're trusting God with that future NOW, not just then. It's a way of saying we believe God's got us this moment, not just in the hereafter. And believing God's promise means trusting God's command to do what we were MADE to do.

On an occasion like Memorial Day Weekend, it can be easy to get caught up in a sense of duty and patriotism and hero worship. After all, we didn't all go into battles, we didn't all do the training, travel to strange places, take up arms, and give up our lives, all for ideals we all claim to own and believe in. While we are, of course, thankful for our veterans. Memorial Day is not about the veterans. It's about the prophets. It's about the people who believed in the dream of our country enough to risk not being able to dream anymore. It about the families who are left without their loved ones for the sake of an idea that the world should be better than we found it. Memorial Day is about remembering what those who sacrificed their lives are empowering us to do now. For all the turmoil, the heartbreak, the struggles, we endure, God's dreams for the end aren't about who's defeated or wiped out or destroyed. God's dreams are about healing, restoring, establishing. God's dreams are

about the notion that Creation, all of Creation, is what God called it from the beginning: good. Very good. What are we doing to help it get there?

Revelation is not hard to understand. It's just hard to conceive and achieve. Revelation is not mysterious or strange. It's just elusive. And our role in all of it hasn't changed. Our mission with Creation is the same as it started. What we know now is that part of our responsibility isn't just to use the earth. God expects us to be healing. That means sometimes giving up our lives to stand up against tyranny. That means sometimes speaking up when the bullying voices want to drown us out. That means refusing to go along with the infections and festering wounds that would keep us broken. That means seeing to it that things, that WE, grow. Our theme is the same as our mission: care for Creation

Why is it possible to do this, even in the face of death?
