(online only) Preparation for Worship

Gather these items for worship. If you don't have a particular item, fret not:

- a piece of white cloth
- an end table or stand
- a plate with bread
- a cup with juice

• a lighter/match

- a glass or bowl of water
- a boat toy or image
- a computer or internetaccessible device
- a thank you card to God for something this week
- For each item you have, thank God for the provision. For each piece you do not have, thank God you don't need it. Place the table/stand in the area you plan to worship. If more than one person will be present, place the table in the middle of where you will be seated. Drape the cloth over it. Arrange the cup, plate, glass of water, and other items on the table. Keep the Bible in front of you. Have enough elements for each person in your household.

Questions for the announcement loop

- What kind of guarantees do you require of God?
- What do you need to know or feel or have before you are ready to act on something God wants from you?
- What kind of guarantees do you require of other people? Of yourself?
- What can God count on from you? What risks does God take in blessing you?

When Do You Sail?

One of the challenges of living is deciding when to take risks. When do you take a chance on something or someone, without a guarantee of the outcome? When do move forward knowing that you might lose or get hurt? As the phrase goes, you cannot sail the seas until you have the courage to leave the shore. What risks are you willing to take? What risks are you willing to take with God and God's direction for you? Is your life of faith dependent on how well God can guarantee your safety or comfort (or rightness)? What does God risk in blessing you?

Bible Heroes

Over the next several weeks we will feature as a theme in the Morning and Online worship services a Bible hero. We will use the lives of these folks to watch how God operates and contrast their choicemaking with our own. Starting this week with Noah and moving through Noah, Moses, Jesus, to the Gospel itself, we will explore lots of examples God gives us to live, learn and, frankly, laugh at ourselves.

Session Meeting Summary

On June 26, the Session met for their regular monthly gathering. After a devotion based on Mark 10:35-40, we prayed for each other and our church. We reviewed minutes and digital decisions (those are things voted on between meetings that have consensus; if any one member wishes to meet in person about something instead, we do so; a digital decision, when it happens, usually centers around something straightforward like which lightbulbs to use or a decision for which we were waiting for more information).

We received letters from Christy McCawley and Matt Lawrence in response to the congregational meeting on June 8th. Those will be published along with the Session's responses. It should be noted, however, that in response to Matt's resignation, the Session, meeting as the Board of Trustees, accepted his resignation and will elect a new president.

We also approved the financial statement for May. Committee Reports were received and highlights discussed, including our ongoing partnership with the Childcare Center with the VBS approach we took this year, Summer education plans, the new leadership for the Blood Drive, review of the HVAC replacement in the Fellowship Hall, status on the repair of the roof of the Education Building, and thanking Elder Kim Ragland for her work securing the grant for the Sanctuary roof resealing. After having researched and prayerful discussion, we said respectfully declined the request by Bradford Academy to make extensive use of our facility for their school.

We talked about the opening negotiations surrounding the Civitan lease renewal. The current lease and its current terms expired last year but the Civitans lease payment and our acceptance of it affects the current lease being active moving forward. We anticipate a long process for this while we wait for a response from the Civitans.

Elder Tammy Karnes was elected to serve on the Nominating Committee and Communion in August

was moved to August 10th in anticipation of the pastor's vacation.

Reading of Scripture

- This is sort of how our faith works. God asks us to trust when we can tell what's happening. But God also asks us to trust when we can't see what will happen. God promises to be there. And we sometimes have to trust that God will be there.
- So when you're around the people who care about you, ask them about times they had to fall backwards into the arms of God.

Sermon: "Leave the Ark"

There's a lot to like about the story of Noah and the Ark. Famously, the menagerie is a part of our cultural imagination. Animals lined up, two by two, filling their way into the massive structure of the boat to avoid the coming doom. In some respects, it reminds me of our time living in Florida. One year in particular, the hurricanes were bad a frequent and numerous. The governor declared some areas for evacuation and you could see the cars, trucks, people, all filing out of the area to safety. Safety.

How many of us direct our lives around the idea of safety? And what does that really mean? When we look at the state of the world currently, it evokes for some the heady days of the Cuban Missile Crisis or other wars that left us feeling on the brink. Drills that had us building bunkers and practicing getting under desks at school. But wars are the only ways we long for safety. Maybe we take our food for granted. Maybe we take our shelter for granted. Maybe we take our bank or investment accounts for granted. Maybe we take our laws or even our beliefs for granted. Maybe we take our loved ones, our homes, for granted. We can make ourselves crazy obsessing about whether we are safe enough. We know all too well there are no quarantees.

But you can imagine what it was like for Noah and his family. God has given him this inanely huge mission to build the Ark. You can imagine the skepticism of his neighbors. And how did he avoid pranks or people sabotaging the building effort? What was it like gathering the materials? What would Noah have done if his family ditched the effort? And this was all challenges he could SEE.

And, let's face it: when the animals started to file in sevens and twos (read the whole story!), you know he had to experience some vindication on some level. I mean it was all happening the way God promised. After everything he went through to even build the Ark, much less get in it and watch the rain fall, and hear the cries of people begging to be let in, he hadn't even gotten to the hard part yet.

This isn't to say that everything that happened to this point wasn't hard. But after floods came and changed the face of the earth, at some point the waters would recede. At some point the land would reappear. At some point, the place God had used to effect their collective salvation would hit shoreline and they would have to face up to the completely unknown and inevitable.

They had to get off of the Ark.

It reminds me of the story of the Transfiguration. Jesus, glorified, shining, standing with Moses and Elijah, the voice of God booming. It was as though the rest of the world didn't matter. And yet, they had to come down from the mountain. The cross still had to happen.

They had to get off of the Ark.

They had to leave the safety, the familiarity, the comfort (such as it was) of the Ark. They had to reenter the world. They were all given the same command as Adam and Eve: replenish the earth. The earth had been unplugged and then plugged in again. How do they guarantee they won't make the same mistakes? How do they avoid the things to go so horribly wrong? How would they meet God's new terms and demands that they...

Well, wait. What did God demand? What contract did God actually draw up? It turns out, God didn't do any of that. Like the earth itself, God simply decided to act, out of God's own grace. Noah didn't make a plea: "Hey God, what if you did...?" or "What if humanity promises to...?" God decided on God's own volition to give a concrete commitment:

"When I bring clouds over the earth and the bow appears in the clouds, I will remember the covenant between me and you and every living being among all the creatures. Floodwaters will never again destroy all creatures."

Importantly, Noah was in the same position that we're in. He didn't earn God's grace, it was given. He didn't design God's promise to us and all Creation, God spoke it to be. Noah, didn't force God's hand or otherwise make God do anything. A heartbroken God chose to make a covenant with earth.

Now, let's be clear: also like Noah, we aren't simply bystanders to God's grace. It's not that anything Noah did or didn't do didn't matter. It matters that Noah said "Yes" to building the Ark. It matters that Noah's family helped him. It matters that Noah got in the thing. It matters that Noah got off of the Ark when the time came. It matters that Noah offered sacrifices of thanksgiving.

Just as a side note, it matters that we say "Thank you." Spoken as someone is terrible at remembering to do so, it matters to God that we say thank you.

But if you think for a moment that Noah's sacrifice is what tipped the scales to God placing the rainbow in the sky, just remember who gave Noah the whole building the Ark plan in the first place. God had decided long before Noah said "Yes" to save Creation from the calamity that was coming.

So where does that leave us?

I think it leaves us with a choice. Actually, it leaves us with lots of choices. When faced with opportunities to help, to save, to ease suffering and to make for peace, we take them, even when it seems crazy. And when God just wants us to settle down and allow God's Spirit to work around us and literally change the world around us, we submit and let it happen. And when the time comes to take those risks with God, to enter into the unknown and trust God's hand, that we remember well Noah and the Ark. Because we can't stay in the Ark forever, but we can be in God's grace indefinitely.

So let us answer together as one Church across time, across our homes, across our various situations, and eat and drink of what the Lord offers. Let us pray...

- Creator God, you have done so much to ensure our futures. You have made and kept your promises. You have blessed us beyond our imaginations (seriously, we didn't even know we needed some of what you've given us). You have even given your life to see to it that we meet you in a New Heaven and a New Earth. You have demonstrated unbridled and incomparable courage with us.
- · It seems the least we can do is say "thank you." But more, we could demonstrate courage with you. We could venture away from our places of safety: our homes, our routines, our perspectives, our philosophies, even our beliefs. Help us leave all the Arks you have provided and walk on the new shores you are showing us. Help us be like you: help us take a chance on our relationship with you.
- Thus, let us be Godly people. Let us make a harvest of the fruit of the Spirit: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness,

gentleness, and self-control. Teach us to live lives weeding out apathy, selfishness, cravenness, callousness, and evil. We pray this not only for ourselves, but for so many that we can name... (take time to name your own prayers)

- Thank you for believing in us, Thank you for transforming us. Thank you for teaching us, even how to pray when words fail us, saying,
- Pray: Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name. Thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our debts as we forgive our debtors. And lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory forever. Amen.
- (take the bread in your hands) On the night in which he was betrayed, Jesus took the bread and having blessed it he broke it, gave it to his disciples and said, "This is my Body given for you. As often as you eat of it, do this in remembrance of me." (break and eat some of the bread)
- (take the cup with juice in your hands) In the same manner he took the cup, and, having blessed it, he gave it to his disciples and said, "This cup represents the new covenant sealed by my blood for the forgiveness of many. All of you drink of it." (drink some of the juice)
- Say: As often as we eat this bread and drink this cup we proclaim the Lord's saving death until He comes. These are the gifts of God for the people of God. Thanks be to God.
- The only proper response to the grace of God is gratitude. Let us pray together with the whole Church:
- Pray: Thank you, God, for making us your kingdom. Help us live out that thanks by being a refuge to all you call us to. Thank you for including us at your Table. Help us do the same with ours. In the great name of Jesus Christ we pray this together. Amen.
