#### Laos Days 11-13

- Luang Prabang: Discover Royal Palace, Wat Xieng Thong, and Kuang Si Waterfalls.
- Join a sacred **Baci Ceremony**, boat to **Pak Ou Caves**, and visit a traditional **whiskey** village.

### **Back to Vietnam** Day 14: Fly to Ho Chi Minh City (Saigon)

 Arrive in bustling southern Vietnam. Evening at leisure or optional street food tour / rooftop dinner.

## Detailed Itinerary

## DAY 1: Arrive in Hanoi - Timeless charm of Vietnam begins

### DAY 2: Arrival in Hanoi, Vietnam – Discover the Historic Heart of the Capital

Upon arrival, immerse yourself in the storied past of the Central Sector of the Imperial Citadel of Thăng Long, a UNESCO World Heritage Site. This ancient complex offers a glimpse into Vietnam's royal legacy and political heritage, dating back over a thousand years.

Continue your cultural exploration with a visit to the **Temple of Literature**, Vietnam's first national university and a striking example of traditional Vietnamese architecture. Stroll through peaceful courtyards and beautifully landscaped gardens that pay tribute to Confucian scholars.

Next, make your way to the scenic **Hoan Kiem Lake**, a serene oasis in the heart of the city. Cross the iconic red bridge to reach the **Ngoc Son Temple**, where legends of the ancient Turtle God and the mystical sword of Emperor Le Loi come to life.

As the evening sets in, enjoy a captivating Water Puppet Show, a unique form of traditional Vietnamese art that originated in the Red River Delta. These performances, set to live folk music, bring centuries-old folktales and legends to life on water.

Conclude your first day in Vietnam by wandering through Hanoi's bustling Old Quarter, renowned for its narrow streets, historic architecture, and vibrant atmosphere. This cultural hotspot is perfect for discovering local handicrafts, sampling authentic Vietnamese street food, and soaking in the rhythm of daily life in the capital.







## DAY 3: Ninh Binh Day Trip from Hanoi – Explore Vietnam's Inland Halong Bay

Embark on a scenic day trip from Hanoi to **Ninh Binh**, often referred to as "Halong Bay on land" for its dramatic limestone landscapes and serene waterways. This region is home to the breathtaking Trang An Landscape Complex, a UNESCO World Heritage Site that seamlessly blends natural beauty with cultural significance.

Begin your journey with a visit to the Hoa Lu Ancient Capital, the political and economic center of Vietnam in the 10th and 11th centuries. Explore the remaining temples dedicated to the Dinh and Le dynasties, nestled amid towering karst formations and lush greenery.

Next, enjoy a tranquil boat ride through Trang An's majestic karst landscapes, where limestone cliffs rise dramatically from emerald waters. Glide through a network of caves, sacred temples, and quiet valleys that offer an unforgettable experience of Vietnam's natural splendor and spiritual depth.

For those looking to delve deeper into the region's charm, consider an optional visit to Bich Dong Pagoda, a picturesque three-tiered temple built into a mountainside, offering panoramic views and peaceful surroundings. You may also explore nearby traditional embroidery villages, where local artisans continue centuries-old crafts passed down through generations.

Return to Hanoi in the evening, enriched by a day of history, culture, and breathtaking scenery in the heart of northern Vietnam.





### DAY 4: Hanoi – Ha Long Bay (Day Trip with En Route Stops)

- Morning:
  - After breakfast, depart from Hanoi to Ha Long Bay (start early around 7:30 AM)
  - En route stop 1: Dong Trieu Ceramic Village Visit a local workshop and see traditional ceramic-making techniques
  - En route stop 2: Green Bean Cake tasting in Hai Duong This regional specialty makes a light and sweet morning snack
- Late Morning to Afternoon Ha Long Bay Cruise:
  - Arrive at Ha Long Bay by late morning and board a day cruise boat
  - · Cruise through the iconic limestone karsts and turquoise waters
  - Visit the spectacular Sung Sot Cave (Surprise Cave)
  - Go **kayaking** or enjoy a **bamboo boat ride** around floating villages or hidden lagoons
  - Join a **cooking demonstration** (typically Vietnamese spring rolls or seafood dishes)
  - Enjoy a **fresh seafood lunch** on board
- Late Afternoon:
  - Cruise ends; disembark and begin the drive back to Hanoi
  - Optional quick stop at a **local pearl farm or handicraft center** if time permits
- Evening:
  - Return to Hanoi by early evening (~7:30 PM)
  - Relax or explore the Old Quarter for dinner

- Tour the Royal Tomb of Emperor Khai Định a fusion of Vietnamese and design, European richly decorated
- Or choose to visit the Royal Tomb of Emperor Minh Mang, set in a tranquil garden landscape reflecting Confucian ideals
- Cultural Highlight (Evening):
  - Attend an Ao Dai fashion show or enjoy a Royal Court Music (Nhã nhạc) performance, **UNESCO-listed** Intangible Cultural Heritage
  - Optional royal-style dinner with traditional Huế dishes





### DAY 7: Hue to Hoi An - A Scenic Journey Along the Hai Van Pass

Today, embark on one of Vietnam's most stunning coastal drives as you travel from Hue to Hoi An via the legendary Hai Van Pass. This scenic route winds between lush mountains and the sparkling South China Sea, offering breathtaking views and photo opportunities at every turn.

Along the way, pass through **Da Nang**, a modern coastal city known for its beaches and cultural landmarks. For those interested, an optional stop at the Marble Mountains provides a chance to explore a cluster of limestone and marble hills dotted with Buddhist sanctuaries, caves, and panoramic viewpoints.

## DAY 9: Hoi An to Siem Reap - Gateway to the Temples of Angkor

## DAY 10: Siem Reap – Sunrise at Angkor Wat and the Mystical Temples of Angkor

- Nguyen Hue Walking Street Enjoy the energetic atmosphere, colonial architecture, cafés, and evening street performances.
