

# The Indo UK Institute of Health (IUIH) scholarship

Its a long-term grant to provide funding to Female Indian students for up to three years of study in the UK

It provides underprivileged students from India the opportunity of furthering their postgraduate education by attending a university in the UK.

#### Value

Funding covers contribution towards international University tuition fees for upto 3 years. The funding does not cover accommodation and living costs.

#### Criteria

Must be an Indian citizen and doing research in gender studies. Working professionals are welcome to apply.

#### **Application deadlines**

15th October 2023 with interview taking place via zoom/physically by 30th November 2023.

#### Award details

IUIH Scholarship will include Fees (UK or Overseas)

The scholarship funds up to three years full-time Education subject to satisfactory progress.



## The Application

Part 1 is for personal information, including English language ability, and previous education and employment. You have to complete all of the mandatory fields in this part before you can go on to Part 2.

Part 2 is where you select the course want to apply for.

## **Supporting documents**

You'll need to include certain documents to support your application, for example evidence of your previous qualifications and a personal statement. You can supply these simply by uploading them to the relevant sections of your online application.

## Proof of your previous degree(s)

This would usually be in the form of an academic transcript or certificate.

## **Official translations into English**

If any of your certificates or transcripts have been issued in a language other than English, you should include with them official, authenticated English translations.

Official translations of qualifications documents are also a requirement of the UK government's visa regulations.

The translation should clearly state that it is an accurate translation of the original, and include all of the following pieces of information:

The translator or translation company's name and contact details

The translator or translation company's credentials or qualifications

The date of the translation



The translator's full name and signature, or the full name and signature of an authorised official from the translation company

The translation should be done by an official translator/translation service.

## Academic references

#### Reference type

We normally require one or two references in support of your application References should be supplied by academic staff at university-level institutions where you've previously studied.

If you've been out of education for the last two years, you can send one academic reference plus one from your current employer if you wish

We would normally expect references be dated no more than two years before the start date of the course you've applied for.

If you've studied at more than one higher education institution, at least one of your references should be from your most recent institution

## Reference content

Your referee(s) should provide their personal opinion of your ability and suitability to undertake postgraduate study, and any distinct strengths and weaknesses (for example motivation, commitment, independence, ability to work under sustained pressure).



How to provide a reference

You can choose to attach references yourself to your application. References should be attached as scanned copies of signed letters on official letterheaded paper.

Please be aware that IUIH and partners may contact your referee(s).

# English language certificates (International applicants)

The certificate from the test provider/awarding body that confirms you have been awarded the qualification.

# Curriculum vitae (CV)/resume

You may also wish to supply a curriculum vitae (CV) or resume. This is particularly useful if you have professional experience that is relevant to the area you want to study.

## Examples of your work

We would ask you to include samples of your current work and how PhD will help you .
