

# Peterson's 1860 Braided Scarf

## Materials

- 1.5 oz Color A – Sport or DK Weight
- 1.5 oz Color B – Sport or DK Weight
- 1.5 oz Color C – Sport or DK Weight
- Size 6 Knitting Needles
- Tapestry Needle
- Size: 46 inches long (tassels not included) X 3 inches wide.

## Let's Start Knitting

**Step 1:** Cast on 7 stitches

**Step 2:** Knit back and forth in garter stitch till desired length. I knit until mine was 50 inches, and it made a 46 inch braided scarf.

**Step 3:** Bind off, dropping the 4th stitch. Run the dropped stitch all the way down to the bottom.



**Step 4:** Knit all three of your strands for the scarf.

**Step 5:** Sew all three strands on one side, into a rounded tip.

**Step 6:** Lay flat onto floor or a table and separate all three strands. Start braiding. I recommend laying flat to braid, as then you can get a nice tension and a flat braid.

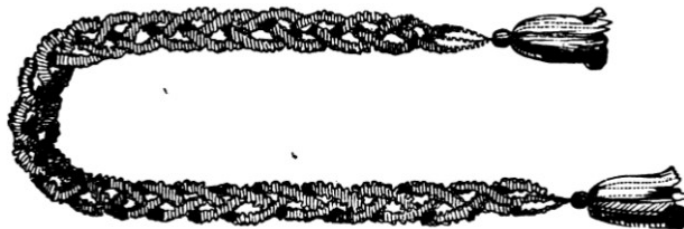
**Step 7:** Sewn together the other side, into a rounded tip.

**Step 8:** Make two tassels. I wrapped three strands around a 6 inch quilting ruler 15 times. (So 45 wraps).

## KNITTED SCARF.

This consists of three little stripes knit with zephyr worsted, which are to be twisted together and adorned with a tassel. Each stripe has a width of seven stitches, and is knitted right. When it is finished, you drop the middle stitch. It looks nice giving a shade of worsted of three colors, in which each stripe is one of these colors.
