Cast Your Nets Again

| John 21 |

After His resurrection, Yeshua began appearing to His disciples shortly after rising. At dawn one morning, He was standing on the shore when His disciples were returning, empty-handed, from a night of fishing on the sea. He tells them to cast their nets to again to the right side of their boat. What happened next was a miracle triggering their recognition of Yeshua, who was already preparing breakfast for them on the shore.

Topical Study Guide

CAST YOUR NETS AGAIN

John 21:1-24

Yeshua's disciples return from fishing and receive a bounty of fish while Yeshua cooks breakfast on the shore for them. Peter has a moment of restoration after having denied Yeshua three times before His death.

YESHUA'S INSTRUCTION & BLESSING

Yeshua told His disciples to cast their nets again to the right of the boat and they would catch fish, and in abundance. Describe a time when you felt defeated, but heard Yeshua tell you to cast your net again? Did you? What were the results of your actions?

MOMENT OF RECOGNITION

It wasn't until the disciples cast their net to the right side and were inundated with fish did they recognize the man on the shore as Yeshua. Why didn't they immediately recognize Him? How do you recognize Yeshua's work in your life?

THE DISCIPLES' JOY

Once Yeshua was recognized, Peter immediately jumped in the water to swim to meet Him. Describe the relationship Peter had with his Messiah. How does his relationship to Yeshua compare to your own?

PETER'S RESPONSE TO SEEING YESHUA

Peter's response to Yeshua was immediate and passionate. He didn't hesitate to be with Him, even swimming to the shore. How excited does spending time with Yeshua make you? What do you put aside so you can run to Him? Are there any areas of distraction keeping you from Him?

THE Q & A OF A LIFETIME

During breakfast, Yeshua asks Peter "Do you love me?" three times. Twice Yeshua uses the Greek agapos followed by phileo the third time. Peter replies with phileo all three times. Discuss the difference in these two forms of love and how each is significant to this interaction.

LOVE FOR THE SAVIOR

What type of love do you have for Messiah Yeshua? How can you grow your love for Him? How do you reflect His love to others? How much time do you spend with Him daily?

TENDER MOMENTS

This gathering of Yeshua with His disciples on the shore that morning displays a very tender and precious moment. Imagine what it would have been like to come home from work empty handed only to have your resurrected Messiah not only fill your net, but cook food for you to eat. How do you share intimate moments with Him? In what simple, quiet ways has He fed you?

EVALUATION OF OUR ACTIONS

How do you show that you love your Messiah each day? Do you shy away from claiming Yeshua around others? What fears do you have that could lead you to deny Yeshua like Peter did?

RESTORATION

We all have moments we aren't proud of, spiritually. Think of a time or situation where Yeshua has restored you during your life. What was the circumstance and how did He restore you to Himself?

RELATIONSHIPS WITH OTHERS

How can we use this moment in scripture to teach us how to relate to others, especially those who are the closest to us? What steps can you take today to connect with those you love in the same way Yeshua did for his disciples?
