February Program - Demonstration of Tucker Trimmer, not just for squaring up blocks

Tucker Trimmer Tool Basics Designed as a trim down ruler for squares that are constructed from triangles, the Tucker Trimmer™ tool helps quilters produce high quality pieces of work. By starting with squares that are slightly larger than necessary, quilters can quickly sew and press units and then trim them down to an exact measurement. The Tucker Trimmer I, II, and III are not just for trimming your finished blocks. It can do so much more. For example, you can make Log Cabin blocks, Curved Log Cabin blocks, Eight at once Half Square Triangles, Shaded Nine Patch, Shaded Four Patch, Cyclone, and more. President's Challenge for 2026

To celebrate the 250th Anniversary of the US - make 250 x 1" squares into a quilt. Just kidding : use red white and blue in a quilt that can be a table runner, lap, full, youth, queen or king. A panel can be used. Presentation at December Luncheon. (Please note that even though a mini quilt is not acceptable for this challenge that 16 blocks with 15 pieces each, plus sashing, a border, machine and hand quilting, binding and a label has as much work involved as a large quilt! Ask me how I know...)

PROGRAM

Beth Fannin introduced our speaker, Vicki Lynn, Smokey Mountain Quilters Guild in Franklin. Vicki showed us her first quilt, that was a complicated BOM, and explained how her friend took her to the Expo, where she bought her first machine! When Vicki retired, she told Maxine, formerly of A Stitch in Time, Franklin, that she wanted a longarm machine. Maxine asked her if her desire for one was so strong that it kept her awake at night. Because her answer was no, she waited 3 more months before she went back to get the machine. Although Vicki does not have a pro stitcher and prefers to do it all free motion - she even sewed around M&Ms! - her quilting is exquisite!

Vicki likes Tilda from Australia, available on Etsy for both patterns and fabric. She has a soft spot for bunnies and names her quilts after her grandchildren. Sometimes Vicki uses wool batting or two layers of cotton batting to create more dimension. She mentioned Laundry Basket Quilts and the "Sew-In-Love" book by Edyta Sitar, in addition to Primitive Gatherings. Vicki also likes cross stitch, wool applique and knitting, and recommended the Cabin Cross Stitch shop in the same parking lot as Mountain Quilts, Hiawassee. The two shops have a reciprocal discount - buy \$35 from one and get a 10% off coupon for the other. Look for a Drizzle pad, long embellishment needles and binding needles. We all enjoyed seeing Vicki's beautiful quilts and were amazed at the intricate applique work and quilting that she displayed for us.

Libby thanked Vicki, and her assistants; Debbie, Chris and Sharon, for a wonderful trunk show. Libby Armstrong adjourned the meeting at 1:40 pm.



Weaving Workshop Bee Artful February 2026

Technique based on *Simply Stunning Woven Quilts* by Anna Faustino

Click on the "Look inside" link to see some of the various types of weaving patterns taught



We will do a simple straight or curvy weaving to learn the techniques in this workshop. Appliques can dress them up.

More challenging cuts can be done later if you wish to continue.

Supplies

- 12" square or rectangle or larger of a bold patterned or graduated fabric
- 12" square fairly solid high contrast color for the weaving
- Base fabric a little larger than the fabrics to be woven- can be cast-off since it will be hidden
- Batting and backing a little larger than finished hanging (add enough for borders if you want them)
- Cutting mat at least 18" (rotating is very useful)
- Rotary Cutter
- Fine Sharpie pen for marking the paper side of the fusible
- Rotary ruler at least 18" long or large square ruler
- Paper-backed fusible web, lightweight from a roll. Need two sheets the size of your fabrics.
 - You will be fusing the backs of each of the two fabrics for the weaving and the weaving ends up stiff, so get the lightest weight fusible you can find. (Steam a Seam is too sticky.)
- Iron
- Pressing board large enough for your project (can be a foam board covered with batting and fabric)
- Pins, Tweezers
- Parchment paper, silicon pressing sheet or freezer paper (the waxy side releases well)
- Glue-resistant machine needles (very important) if you will stitch after fusing to background.
- Sewing machine, supplies, threads optional – we may just get the weaving done in class

Ice-dyed and a solid hand-dyed fabric work out well for this project. I will have a few copies of the circle templates available, but this adds a lot of time to the project. Better to start easy and do the complicated when you have more time.
