Participants can cut and sew 3 to 5 blocks to assemble as a table runner, or more blocks can be made to assemble as a quilt size of your choosing. The possibilities are endless depending on each guilter's choice of fabrics, variation of fabrics between multiple blocks, and choice of a border for the runner or quilt. There is no charge to members for this workshop. The fee for non-members is \$15.00.

MOUNTAIN LAUREL QUILTERS GUILD WONDER CURVE RULER WORKSHOP WITH SUSAN ATKINS – JULY 25, 2025

Supply List:

45mm rotary cutter and mat

28mm rotary cutter if you have one

Sewing machine

Basic sewing gear - pins, scissors, threads, seam ripper (always!!)

Wonder Curve Ruler (the butterfly pattern comes w/the ruler, the ruler can be purchased at your favorite local quilt shop

Fabric Needed for 1 square:

One (1) 10" square for the wings

1/4 yard for the background fabric

One (1) 2" x 5" inch rectangle for the body (this is enough to allow for cutting errors)

Fabric Needed for Table Runner:

Five (5) 10" squares for the wings

2/3 yard for the background fabric

Five (5) 2" x 5" inch rectangles for the bodies (this is enough to allow for cutting errors)

Supply List:

45mm rotary cutter and cutting mat

Sewing machine

Basic sewing gear - pins, scissors, threads, seam ripper (always!!)


Squares and rulers (12", 16", 18", 24" - the biggest square you have is recommended for squaring the panel, and the longest ruler is recommended for the longer cuts in cutting the panel into pieces)

Fabric

Fabric panel of your choosing - any size, any theme (panel should be prewashed and uncut) The amount of fabric needed for the window frame, the sills, the vertical shadows, and the borders will vary, depending on the initial size of the panel and the finished quilt size desired. Following is an example: Using a 42" x 28" panel cut in 12 pieces, you will need 1/2 yard fabric for the sill, 3/4 yard fabric for the window frame and the inner border and 1 1/4 yard for the outer border and the window frame shadow pieces. A smaller panel will require incrementally less fabric for the sill, the frame and the borders, and a larger panel will require incrementally more. The photo below is provided for guidance, showing the relative placement of the panel pieces, the sill, the window frame, the inner border and the outer border. In this example, the panel has been cut into 18 pieces. In this example, the panel pieces are blue, the sill pieces are white, the window frame and the inner border are dark green, and the outer border and the window frame shadow are the lighter green.



Thank you from Circle of Hope





The top to this heirloom treasure quilt was dropped off by an anonymous donor to the Circle of Hope Thrift Store in Clarkesville, Georgia, sometime in January 2025. The hundreds of hexagons in the quilt top were hand cut and handsewn together sometime in the past by the unknown maker or makers - the fabrics in the quilt top are believed to be 1940's-1950's vintage. We can only wonder at the number of hours that went into cutting, piecing, and sewing the quilt top. Some family's life together is lovingly recorded in the fabrics – leftover scraps and pieces salvaged from shirts and dresses, curtains, and children's pajamas.

A Circle of Hope thrift shop volunteer purchased the quilt top for the purpose of making a completed quilt to be gifted back to the Circle of Hope to be used for fundraising purposes. The finished quilt was assembled, quilted and the binding sewn on by members of the Mountain Laurel Quilters Guild. Long arm quilting services were generously donated by a local member of the quilt community. The backing and binding fabrics are 100% cotton, the batting is 80/20 cotton. Hand washing is highly recommended, tumble dry on low heat or line dry.
