

## The birth of the Order of the Vestals

This text comes from the book: *The Archangel Gabriel biography*

*The last presence of the Order of the Vestals took place in ancient Rome. It came from a very ancient tradition that came from Greece and from the Mysteries of Egypt.*

*The vestals were priestesses of fire destined from their youngest age to maintain the flame that was never to be extinguished.*

*This flame was the fire of the family and of the hearth, of the good understanding among men. In the year 400, this order was forbidden by the Catholic Church which, strengthened by its union with the State, had all non-Christian cults and beliefs banned. And the Order of the Vestals fell into oblivion...*



*In the spring of 2005, the Archangel Gabriel asked Olivier Manitaro to consecrate 2 priestesses who would be dedicated to him. Their function was twofold. On the one hand, they had to take care of the source and of the temple of Father Gabriel in the Essene Village of Terranova, maintain them, and on the other hand, they had to*

*keep pure the ethers of water in the subtle worlds, to ensure that no impurity could fecundate the waters.*

*For this, they had to work daily with the subtlety of water through a great devotion, a purity of intention, noble feelings so that Father Gabriel might remain present in the subtlety of life and that the soul might enter into contact with his symbols and his Teaching as transmitted and manifested in the Essene Tradition. Thus, they became the physical and subtle guardians of the body of the Archangel in his present incarnation on the earth.*

*These 2 vestals of water were consecrated during the celebration of the feast of Enoch<sup>1</sup> in May 2005, in the presence of the Archangel, through a ceremony that he had given.*

*It is thus that, through the water of Gabriel, the Order of the Vestals was resurrected.*

*Afterwards, for each Archangel, vestals were consecrated as guardians of fire, air and earth.*

1 - Also called feast of Wesak, the feast of Enoch is the celebration of the Tradition of the Masters of Light, at the full moon of the month of May. It is the celebration of the man who has found the Divinity within himself and who realizes it in his daily life.
