

Judah Will Wake Up the People: Remembering Our Identity as Hebrews

Shalom Family, let's dive into this topic together and see what the Word of Yah reveals.

As the covenant people of the Most High, we are called to be a light unto all nations (Isaiah 42:6). In recent times, many of us are awakening to our identity as Hebrews. This awakening is a divine process guided by Yah Himself, who places knowledge, understanding, and wisdom into our hearts through His Holy Spirit (John 14:26; 1 Corinthians 2:10-12).

It is important to remember that our identity is not defined by the world's understanding of Judaism. The Jewish nation, as recognized by the world today, follows traditions and customs that are not necessarily aligned with the covenantal practices Yah gave to His people. While we may admire the preservation of their culture, our path is uniquely ours, rooted in the covenant promises made to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob (Genesis 12:1-3; 28:14). We cannot simply adopt their customs; instead, we must seek Yah's guidance to walk in His ways as He reveals them to us.

Judah and the Awakening of the People

Scripture points to the tribe of Judah playing a pivotal role in awakening the covenant people. In Jeremiah 31:28-34, Yah promises a new covenant with His people, placing His law in their hearts. This spiritual revival comes through the descendants of Judah, who are charged with leading the people back to obedience and understanding of His Torah.

Hosea 3:4-5 also states:

“For the children of Israel shall abide many days without a king, and without a prince, and without sacrifice, and without pillar, and without ephod, and without teraphim: Afterward shall the children of Israel return, and seek Yah their Elohim, and David their king; and shall fear Yah and His goodness in the latter days.”

Here, the reference to David (from Judah) highlights how Yah will raise up leaders from Judah to guide the people in returning to Him. The revival is spiritual, led by the Spirit of Yah, awakening His covenant people to their true identity and purpose.

Walking in Our True Identity

As we wake up to our Hebrew identity, we must seek Yah's Spirit to teach us His ways. The Scriptures remind us that knowledge of Him comes not from worldly sources but from His Spirit:

- John 16:13: "Howbeit when He, the Spirit of truth, is come, He will guide you into all truth..."
- Proverbs 2:6: "For Yah gives wisdom; out of His mouth comes knowledge and understanding."

Our goal is to be a light unto all nations, not by imitating the Jewish nation as the world knows them, but by walking in covenant truth as revealed by Yah.

The awakening of the covenant people is ongoing, and Judah has a central role in this spiritual revival. As we grow in knowledge and understanding through Yah's Spirit, we must remain true to our Hebrew identity, embracing the covenant promises and walking in the ways of the Most High. Our mission is clear: **to shine His light and lead others into the knowledge of His truth.**
