

# Walking in the Commandments Through the Ruach HaKodesh

Shalom Family, let's dive into this topic together and see what the Word of Yah reveals.

## How the Holy Spirit Empowers Us to Live Set Apart Without Abandoning the Torah

Many believers misunderstand the role of the Ruach HaKodesh (Holy Spirit). Some think The Spirit was given so that we no longer need to follow Yahuah's commandments. This is not true. In fact, the Ruach HaKodesh is given to help us obey the Torah and live holy, set-apart lives.

## 1. The Ruach HaKodesh Was Given to Empower Obedience

Yahshua promised that the Ruach HaKodesh would guide, teach, and strengthen believers to follow Yahuah's ways:

- *John 14:26 – “But the Helper, the Ruach HaKodesh, whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you.”*
- *Acts 1:8 – “But you shall receive power when the Ruach HaKodesh comes upon you, and you shall be witnesses to Me...”*

The Spirit does not remove our responsibility to obey; instead, He gives us the strength, understanding, and desire to walk in Yahuah's commands.

## 2. The Ruach HaKodesh Does Not Abolish the Torah

Some believe that the giving of the Holy Spirit means we no longer need the law. Scripture, however, makes the opposite clear:

- *Matthew 5:17–18 – “Do not think that I came to destroy the Torah or the Prophets. I did not come to destroy but to fulfill. For truly, I say to you, till heaven and earth pass away, one jot or one tittle shall by no means pass from the Torah till all is fulfilled.”*
- *Romans 7:12 – “Therefore the Torah is holy, and the commandment is holy, and righteous, and good.”*

The Spirit empowers us to keep the commandments in a way that is impossible in our own strength.

### **3. How the Ruach HaKodesh Helps Us Obey**

The Spirit works in our hearts and minds in multiple ways:

#### a) Conviction of Sin

- The Spirit makes us aware when we stray from Yahuah's commands.
- *John 16:8: "And when He has come, He will convict the world of sin, and of righteousness, and of judgment."*

#### b) Teaching and Reminding

- He teaches the meaning of Scripture and reminds us of Yahshua's instructions.
- *John 14:26: "...He will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you."*

#### c) Producing Fruit That Enables Obedience

- Love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control are the fruit of the Spirit (Galatians 5:22–23).
- These qualities help us naturally obey Yahuah and love others, fulfilling the greatest commandments.

#### d) Empowering Boldness and Strength

- The Spirit gives us the courage to stand against sin and worldly pressures.
- *Acts 1:8: "You shall receive power... to be witnesses to Me."*

### **4. Walking in Torah Through the Spirit**

Obedience is not about external rule-keeping alone. The Ruach HaKodesh works from within, renewing our hearts to desire Yahuah's commands and live holy lives:

- *Ezekiel 36:26–27 – "I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit within you... and I will put My Spirit within you and cause you to walk in My statutes."*

The Spirit helps us love the Torah, delight in obedience, and walk set apart from the nations.

## 5. Conclusion

The Ruach HaKodesh (Holy Spirit) was not given to abolish Yahuah's law. Instead, The Spirit is given to empower, guide, and strengthen believers to live according to Yahuah's commandments.

- The Spirit teaches us, reminds us of Yahshua's words, convicts us of sin, produces fruit in us, and gives courage to walk in obedience.
- Through the Spirit, keeping the Torah becomes not a burden but a pathway to holiness, love, and a set-apart life.

As believers filled with the Ruach HaKodesh, we can confidently walk in Yahuah's commands, love Him fully, and love our neighbors, knowing that His Spirit is working within us to make obedience possible.

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# Daily Guide: Walking in the Commandments Through the Ruach HaKodesh

This guide shows how to rely on the Spirit to obey Yahuah's commands, love Him, and live a set-apart life.

## 1. Invite the Ruach HaKodesh to Guide You

- ☑ Begin each day with prayer, asking the Spirit to teach, remind, and strengthen you.
  - Scripture: *John 14:26* – “He will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you.”
- ☑ Ask for boldness and strength to walk in obedience.
  - Scripture: *Acts 1:8* – “You shall receive power... to be witnesses to Me.”

## 2. Let the Spirit Convict and Correct

- ☑ Pay attention to convictions of sin; confess and turn away immediately.
  - Scripture: *John 16:8* – “...He will convict the world of sin, and of righteousness, and of judgment.”
- ☑ Reflect on areas where you may be compromising in Torah obedience or love for others.

## 3. Rely on the Spirit's Fruit to Obey

- ☑ Daily focus on producing love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.
  - Scripture: Galatians 5:22–23
- ☑ Ask: “Am I acting in love toward Yahuah and my neighbor today?”

## 4. Meditate on Torah and Yahshua's Words

- ☑ Study Scripture and let the Spirit reveal understanding.
  - Scripture: *John 14:26* – “He will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you.”

- Memorize key verses that guide obedience.

## 5. Apply Obedience Daily

- Follow practical steps for walking in holiness:

- Worship Yahuah alone.
- Observe Sabbath and appointed times.
- Show justice, mercy, and humility toward others.
- Keep moral purity and honesty in daily life.

Scripture: Ezekiel 36:26–27 – “I will put My Spirit within you and cause you to walk in My statutes.”

## 6. End the Day with Reflection

- Ask the Spirit to reveal where you obeyed and where you need improvement.
- Confess failures and thank Yahuah for guidance and strength.

### Tip:

- Keeping a journal of your daily obedience and how the Spirit guided you can help strengthen your walk and notice growth over time.
- Small consistent steps matter more than perfection.
