ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR 2022 -2023

INTRODUCTION

It gives me a great pleasure and Pride to present the Sixth Annual Report of our prestigious institution which is oriented towards enlightenment and empowerment of rural women through Curricular oriented and a value based education. Over a span of six years, from 2017-18 to 2022-23, the college has achieved remarkable growth and development.

PROGRAMS OFFERED

Our College offers thirteen Programs, ten UG and three PG. The faculty of Arts includes four UG Programs, viz. B. A. English, Tamil, History and commerce and PG Programs viz. M.A English and M.com, The Science faculty includes five UG Programs viz. B.Sc Maths, Chemistry, Physics, Computer science and zoology and PG Program viz. M Sc. Computer science. The Management faculty includes B.B.A at the UG level. Other Viable and employable courses are intended to be started in due course.

ENROLLMENT OF STUDENTS:-

Having started with eight students in the academic Year 2017-18, the student strength has increased to seven hundred in the year 2022-23. There has been a progressive increase in the admission with 144 in the year 2018-19, 329 during 2019-20, 508 during 2020-21, 578 during 2021-22.
