ABOUT KIDS HOPE

During the EBOLA CRISIS in West Africa, our hearts came to light for Ganta, Liberia, when we found 84 children having lost parents, entire families, and were abandoned. A brave individual named Emmanuel joined 80 other teachers to go from village to village educating residents about EBOLA and how to minimize transmission. As a result, EBOLA deaths in the area dropped from 16 per week to 2 per week. While Monrovia, the capital city of Liberia, experienced more than 500 deaths per week. An NGO was formed due to the inability of finding funds for expensive expensive schools. 250 needy kids were identified by the men there. More than \$25,000 per year would be needed to help all of these kids but, only \$3500 worth of donations could be found at the time.

Emmanuel found men and two women willing to be part of the formation of the NGO. After proper documentation and procedures followed the NGO was formed and operational. They formed "Kids Hope Better Future Foundation Academy" Which is where the work began. This is a school of quality Christian education. The fees are affordable for local students and orphans join unable to pay the fees.

The Lord continued to move and led Kids Hope Inc. to focus on the orphans' future by providing a strong foundation on Christ and education. Through generous contributions, Kids Hope Inc. Indianapolis aids and supports the NGO in Liberia and Surrounding area schools. As numbers grow and the need grows a permanent location with a bigger and more secure building is needed. For this purpose, a piece of land was purchased in Ganta in 2020. Excavation of the land and the foundation for a 12-classroom building have begun. However, more donations are needed to continue the work. By providing support to Orphan children through technology and Education. Kids Hope continues to impact many schools, Communities, Etc.

Therefore, it did not only claim lives, but also make living condition very difficult, for the private school teacher's, but through your help most of our problems are been solved little by little.


However, the fund was also able to build up the hope of orphans by meeting most of their basic need; we pray and hope that it will continue so that we can be in school.



FACTS ABOUT LIBERIA



- The three countries at the centre of the current Ebola outbreak, Sierra Leone, Liberia and Guinea, were ranked towards the bottom of the 2013 Human Development Index. Out of 187 countries and territories, they ranked 174 (Liberia), 177 (Sierra Leone) and 178 (Guinea)
- Liberia has been through two civil wars since 1989, the second ending in 2003
- Estimated Population of Ganta, Liberia also known as Gompta is 290,000
- Liberia was established in 1822 as a colony for freed slaves from the United States.
 These former slaves were given the opportunity to establish a new home in Africa,
 free from the discrimination and oppression they faced in America. Over time, the
 colony grew and eventually declared independence from the American Colonization
 Society in 1847, becoming Africa's first independent republic.
- Liberia's economy is heavily dependent on its natural resources, including rubber, timber, and minerals such as iron ore and diamonds. The country has struggled with poverty and inequality, but has made progress in recent years thanks to increased foreign investment and economic reforms.
- Liberia's flag features 11 alternating red and white stripes, symbolizing the 11 signatories of the Liberian Declaration of Independence. The flag also features a blue square with a white star in the center, representing the country's position as a beacon of hope for African freedom. Liberia's motto is "The love of liberty brought us here."
- English is the official language of Liberia, but many Liberians also speak one or more of the country's indigenous languages. There are over 20 indigenous Tribal languages include Kpelle, Bassa, and Mano, among others.
