Foundational Charter

Official Founding Document

Established 2024 – Founded in Norway

Independent International Riding Association

Article 1 – Identity

Nakba48 Riders Global is an independent international riding association of a humanitarian and cultural character. It is strictly non-political and non-partisan.

The association is not a Motorcycle Club (MC) and does not operate under regional club systems or traditional MC structures. It does not claim territorial control, dominance, or exclusive representation of any area, and it operates in full compliance with the laws and regulations of each country in which it is active.

Article 2 – Historical Memory and Humanitarian Purpose

The name “Nakba48” reflects the principle of historical remembrance and human awareness.

The association honors history as a source of reflection and learning from past tragedies, while promoting dignity, unity, and collective responsibility. Its purpose is to inspire present and future generations to draw lessons from history and contribute to preventing similar human suffering anywhere in the world.

Article 3 – Neutrality and Non-Hostility

Nakba48 Riders Global does not organize, support, sponsor, or participate in political parties, election campaigns, governmental movements, religious institutions, or international conflicts.

The association does not promote hostility toward any state, government, nation, religion, or people. Its mission is grounded in cultural memory, humanitarian values, peaceful coexistence, and mutual respect.

Article 4 – Respect for the Global Riding Community

Nakba48 Riders Global is not a Motorcycle Club (MC) and does not use or claim the Three-Piece Patch system.

The association respects the traditions, hierarchy, and protocols of the global riding community in every country in which it operates.

Article 5 – Integrity and Representation

The name, logo, insignia, and visual identity of the association represent cultural heritage and humanitarian principles.

They may not be used in partisan political events, armed conflicts, religious mobilization, or any context that contradicts the neutral and humanitarian character of the association.

Any official representation of the association must reflect dignity, responsibility, and respect, and must align with its principles of peace, awareness, and coexistence.

Article 6 – Mission and Humanitarian Objectives

The mission of Nakba48 Riders Global is to transform the passion for motorcycling into a positive platform that serves universal humanitarian values.

The association strives to achieve the following objectives:

1. Building Bridges: Promoting cultural dialogue and human connection among peoples through shared riding activities, free from confrontational or exclusionary rhetoric.

2. Promoting a Culture of Peace: Affirming that historical memory serves as motivation to build a future founded on tolerance, justice, and mutual respect.

3. Social Responsibility: Organizing or supporting community and volunteer initiatives such as road safety campaigns, environmental protection efforts, and charitable activities that benefit society without discrimination.

4. Professionalism and Example: Presenting a respectful and disciplined model of the rider who complies with local and international traffic laws, respects public order, and embodies responsibility and integrity on the road.

Article 7 – Adoption

This Foundational Charter is formally adopted and enters into force on the date indicated below. It constitutes the official and primary reference framework for the identity and guiding principles of Nakba48 Riders Global.

Article 8 – Legal Framework and Compliance

This Charter does not supersede, override, or replace the laws and regulations of any country in which Nakba48 Riders Global operates.

In jurisdictions where the association is formally registered or legally recognized, applicable national laws and statutory requirements shall prevail.

Article 9 – Individual Responsibility of Members

All members act in their personal capacity and are individually responsible for their conduct and actions.

The association shall not be held liable for personal acts that fall outside its officially authorized activities.

Article 9.1 – Personal Additions to Official Identity

Any patches, symbols, or insignia worn by members beyond the official Nakba48 Riders Global identity are personal and do not represent the association. Personal additions must not resemble any Motorcycle Club (MC) structure, Three-Piece Patch, or similar. No political, religious, violent, or territorial symbols are allowed. Small personal symbols or journey marks are allowed if clearly personal and neutral. Members are fully responsible for their personal additions.

Article 10 – Amendments

Amendments to this Foundational Charter may be adopted in accordance with the internal governance procedures of the association.

Any modification must remain consistent with the principles of neutrality, humanitarian purpose, and respect for international law.
