Article 1 - Legal Disclaimer

1.1 Nakba48 Riders Global is an independent humanitarian and cultural riding association. It is not a Motorcycle Club (MC) and has no affiliation with any MC organization worldwide.

1.2 The association is strictly neutral and does not engage in political, religious, violent, or armed activities.

1.3 The association does not represent, endorse, or support any political party, movement, or ideology.

1.4 All members are personally responsible for their actions and any misuse of the association's name, logo, or identity.

1.5 The association is not liable for any individual actions outside the scope of this Code of Conduct, to the maximum extent permitted by applicable law.

Article 2 - Identity & Purpose

2.1 The reference to Nakba 1948 is purely historical, humanitarian, and cultural, and does not represent a political position.

2.2 The association aims to:

2.2.1 Promote human dignity and peaceful coexistence.

2.2.2 Raise cultural awareness among riders worldwide.

2.2.3 Foster unity among members under a neutral identity.

Article 3 - Organizational Structure (Non-MC Definition)

3.1 The association is not a Motorcycle Club (MC) and does not follow MC structures.

3.1.1 There are no ranks, including prospect or ranking systems.

3.1.2 There are no MC-style hierarchies.

3.1.3 There are no territorial claims.

3.2 Chapters are administrative coordination units only, not MC-style entities.

Article 4 - Responsible Use & Media Policy

4.1 Members must always use the association identity responsibly.

4.2 Prohibited:

4.2.1 Political, religious, violent, or MC-related representation.

4.2.2 Unauthorized public statements on behalf of the association.

4.2.3 Sharing internal or confidential information.

4.3 Only officially designated coordinators may speak on behalf of the association.

4.4 Any misrepresentation may result in official clarification or correction by the association.

Article 5 - Events & Activities

5.1 Participation is limited to peaceful humanitarian or cultural riding activities.

5.2 The association does not organize, support, or participate in political demonstrations or protests.

5.3 Wearing the official patch requires approval from local chapter coordination.

5.4 Compliance with local laws is mandatory.

5.5 Any violation is the sole responsibility of the member.

Article 6 - Annual Global Ride – Nakba Day (May 15)

6.1 A symbolic global ride held annually on May 15.

6.2 Purpose:



6.2.1 Peaceful remembrance.

6.2.2 Cultural awareness.

6.2.3 Rider unity under a neutral humanitarian identity.

6.3 Each chapter defines its own route and timing according to local laws.

Article 7 - Social Media Policy

7.1 Only humanitarian, cultural, and riding-related content is allowed under the association identity.

7.2 Prohibited: Political or partisan content. Religious advocacy. Violent content. And any MC-style representation or claims.

7.3 Suggested hashtags: #Nakba48Riders, #GlobalRiders, and #PeacefulRide

7.4 Members must clearly separate personal content from association identity.

Article 8 - Solidarity & Political Content Clarification

8.1 Expressions of solidarity related to explicitly political, partisan, electoral, or protest-based activities are not permitted under the name, platforms, or identity of Nakba48 Riders Global.

8.2 The association does not endorse, promote, or share political campaigns or protests, even if not organized by it.

8.3 Any use of the association name, logo, patch, vest, or platforms in such context may be interpreted as endorsement and is strictly prohibited.

8.4 Members may express personal opinions or solidarity only in their individual capacity, provided that:

8.4.1 No association name, logo, or identity is used.

8.4.2 No implication of representation is made.

8.4.3 The association remains strictly neutral and does not take any political position, directly or indirectly.

Article 9 - Discipline & Enforcement

9.1 Violations include:

9.1.1 Misuse of patch or identity.

9.1.2 Unsafe or illegal behaviour while representing the association.

9.1.3 Unauthorized communication or misrepresentation.

9.1.4 Breach of neutrality principles.

9.2 Possible actions:

9.2.1 Official warning.

9.2.2 Temporary suspension.

9.2.3 Membership termination.

Article 10 - External Collaboration

10.1 Collaboration is only permitted with humanitarian or cultural organizations.

10.2 All collaborations must be officially documented.

10.3 Political, religious, or partisan cooperation is strictly prohibited.

Article 11 - Guests & Visitors

11.1 Members hosting guests are fully responsible for their guests' behaviour during participation.

11.2 Guests must comply with all rules.

Article 12 - Freedom to Ride & Personal Responsibility

12.1 Members may ride independently or with other groups outside the association.

12.2 While representing the association, members must not engage in:

12.2.1 Political or partisan activity.

12.2.2 Violence or illegal conduct.

12.2.3 Any behaviour harming safety or reputation.

12.3 All actions while representing the association remain individual responsibility.

Article 13 - Country Adaptation Clause

13.1 The association operates internationally under a unified identity.

13.2 All activities must comply with local laws and regulations.

13.3 Local chapters may adapt operational practices, including, Event organization formats, Communication methods. And Visibility or presentation adjustments when required for legal or safety reasons.

13.4 Such adaptations must Not alter the core identity (name, logo, neutrality). Not introduce political, religious, or MC-style elements. And not create territorial or hierarchical interpretations.

13.5 Any significant adaptation should be reported to global coordination.

Article 14 - General Principles

14.1 Maintain strict neutrality at all times.

14.2 Focus on humanitarian and cultural values.

14.3 Respect law, safety, and public responsibility.

14.4 Avoid any political or military association.

Article 15 - Official Adoption

15.1 Adopted: 2024 – Norway.

15.2 Applies globally to all members and chapters.
