### I can see clearly now the rain is gone...





## Member Spotlight Denise Vrana



It's important for each of us to do whatever we can to make a difference during these challenging times. When Federal funding cuts to Medicaid and other critical services transpired, Denise Vrana recognized the devastating impact that these changes could have on her community and our state. She grew concerned for those with limited resources who might find themselves in need and at the same time grew frustrated with popular communication platforms that use algorithms to control communications and narratives. Thus, she felt compelled to create Tempest-Tost: an alternative option to traditional communication platforms.

She describes Tempest-Tost as "our chaos contingency forum where "we the people" will create order in the midst of those who wish to do us harm. It was developed out of an ever-increasing need for a safer place to share away from the typical social media sites. A place where we can freely share resistance ideas, local needs, and community building efforts with a vision towards the future."
