Next Annual Meeting

Syttende Mai is celebrated in many Norwegian migrant communities throughout the world. Click on the city to be taken to their website:



Event Schedule

Wednesday, July 9th

The stevne will begins with a tour and lunch starting at 11:00 am at St. Olaf Church in Austin. After lunch, participants are expected to carpool to the town of Grand Meadow, Minnesota for guided tours of the Bear Creek Norwegian Lutheran Church, The GAR (Grand Army of the Republic Hall), also known as Booth Post No. 130, and the Grand Meadows Chert Quarry. Return time is estimated at 5:00pm.

Thursday, July 10th

Will begin at 8:00 am with registration and genealogy.

The Opening Session begins at 9:00 am and features a Keynote Address by Dale Goodman

arranged through the Vesterheim Museum in Decorah, IA. This presentation follows the story of the 1825 "Restauration Sloop" from its voyage across the Atlantic, the reception in New York City and ends with the first Norwegian Settlement in Kendall, NY.

Classes begin after lunch and the evening is set aside for individual Lag meetings.

Friday, July 11th

Expect a full day of genealogy and classes. There will be a banquet with entertainment to follow by the Norwegian Singing Bachelors.

Saturday, July 1st

Closing session (9:00-11:30 am) features George Olson and his presentation entitled "They Brought More Than Lutefisk and Lefse." A mixture of light history, traditions, some humor and song, both traditional that our immigrant ancestors brought with them and "immigrant" songs. A Bunad Parade and entertainment will officially end the stevne.

Event Speakers

Dean Uland – Instructor at Riverland Community College, Austin, MN. His areas of interest are agriculture, including local and regional Minnesota history, as well as topics in immigration and World War I.

Miranda Moen - Architectural Designer and Founder MO/EN DESIGN PRACTICE, LLC, Austin, MN. Miranda has done research on Norwegian-American architecture and its influences from Norway. She will provide background on regional building customs in Norway and then transition into its relationship to the houses built by Norwegian-Americans, specifically her ancestor's house in Spring Grove, MN.

Karen Fried & Nancy Gulbranson, food demonstrators. Nancy is a retired Family & Consumer Science teacher/HS Principal. Karen is a retired Spring Grove School District employee and member of the SG Sons of Norway Lodge. Both are members of the Spring Grove Giants of the Earth Heritage Center. They will be making Norwegian Kransekake (Norwegian Wedding Cake) and also a fun demonstration.

Thomas Jacobson will speak on Pastor Clausen who worked on establishing mission churches among Norwegian settlements. He was the pastor who was active at Beaver Creek.

Caitlin Sackrison recently received her PhD in Norwegian studies and can speak on a variety of topics with an interest in women settlers.

Candace Simar is a renowned author from Pequot Lakes, MN and is the grandchild of Scandinavian immigrants. She enjoys a passion for Minnesota history and how things might have been. She will have her books on sale.

Did Your Norwegian Ancestors Settle in Utah?



Telemark to America Series Available to Purchase from Telelaget Store



Any Historical Stories You Want to Share?

The *Telesoga* focuses on preserving the stories of generations of Telemarkings on both sides of the Atlantic. Torkel Oftelie, cofounder of *Telelaget* and first editor of *Telesoga*, traveled throughout the Midwest documenting the lives of emigrants from Telemark.

In the spirit of Torkel and those who followed him, we are intent on keeping the memory of our Telemark ancestry and heritage alive with submissions to the *Telesoga* from our members.

Basics for submitting a story:

- Articles can be of any length but with a Telemark connection. This can be a past or current connection.
- Submission deadlines are mid-March for the May issue and mid September for the November issue
- If you have a story to tell, but aren't sure you have the skills to tell it very well, just write it up as best you can. We have several members in our lag who will help you "polish it."
- There is no monetary payment for your writing, but you will receive five copies of the *Telesoga* to share with family and friends.

Introducing FamilySearch Labs

At RootsTech 2024, FamilySearch spread the word about an



exciting new venture on its website: the <u>FamilySearch Labs</u>. At the current time, there are five experiments you can try, after signing in to FamilySearch:

- Expand Your Search with Full Text –
 There are a few collections that can now be searched with full-text capabilities and keyword searches. A video is available for explaining the search tips that are available.
- Family Group Trees Family group trees let you share important family memories and information with close living family. You can create family groups and invite them to share your family group trees.
- Find Help with AI Search Use AI queries to find answers in the Help Center, the FamilySearch Wlki, RootsTech videos, etc.
- Together by FamilySearch Share stories, memories, activities, etc. across family groups and with an app on mobile devices.
- Profile Quality Score Choose from a number of selected ancestor profiles in FamilySearch and see how the information is rated for quality, from low to high.

Sources are evaluated and potential data problems are identified so that profile information can be improved.

These new features are still in testing mode and should be finalized later this year. The Family History Guide will have documentation for the features when they are finished.

Bill Hoberg


