Telelaget:The First 100 Years 1907-2007 - USD \$20.00 Sale: \$16.00

Telelaget of America celebrated its 100th Anniversary in 2007 and published this collection. The contents of this volume include the history of the *bygdelag* & *stevner*, the history of board members and translators, the Telesoga and TeleNews, group tours to and from Norway, and Telelaget's age of technology.



Telemark to America: Volume I - - USD \$20.00 Sale: \$16.00

In 1837 the first Telemark emigrants set off for America beginning a stream of thousands starting a new life in a strange land. They retained a love for Telemark that has been passed down through the generations. This volume is a collection of articles written both by authors from Telemark and Americans with roots in Telemark, as well as translations of articles written long ago. It tells as complete but concise a story of Telemark emigration as possible and gives insight into the country that the immigrants left behind.



Telemark to America: Volume II - - USD \$20.00 Sale: \$16.00

In 1992, Telelaget printed 500 copies of Telemark to America Volume II-Settlements; it has since been revised and updated. This volume is rich with settlement history from Wisconsin, Iowa, and Minnesota. This 179-page book has an index including over 5,500 names and places. All the chapters are translations from the early Telesoga written by Torkel Oftelie. Torkel visited most of the Telemark settlements in the above-mentioned states between the years 1907 to 1926. The first issue of Telesoga, published in 1909, contained the first settlement history. Torkel documented the names of those living in these settlements and the stories of their ancestors - the first settlers in these areas. Revisions in the book included adding twenty-four more pictures, making numerous translation and grammatical corrections, explaining the location of many place names, and making it more user-friendly for younger generations by translating slang terms.




Telemark to America: Volume III Settlements, Biographies and Telemark Lore - - USD \$20.00 Sale: \$16.00

Volume III of the Telemark to America series was published and released in July 2011. The book is divided into three parts: articles on settlement history, emigrant biographies, and Telemark folklore. Much of the content was provided by Torkel Oftelie who he spent over twenty years visiting the settlements and documenting the lives of the Telemark emigrants. Torkel was concerned that the rich Telemark cultural heritage not be left behind. As with the other volumes, it is a valuable resource in searching for your Telemark ancestors, farms, and customs

The text is both in Norwegian and English. Orabel Thortvedt, granddaughter of pioneer Olav G. Geitestad/Thortvedt, devoted much of her life exploring and depicting her story. She was a trained artist, loved animals and was inordinately interested in local history. This beautiful, coffee table style, book portrays the work of this fascinating artist, while at the same time telling a touching family saga.




