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Introduction

This devotional was created to help you align your financial habits with God’s Word. In a world that often measures success by wealth, Jesus calls us to a higher standard: faithful stewardship, wise spending, and generosity that blesses others.

As you walk through these 30 days, remember that financial goals must be realistic and Godly. Do not create burdensome goals that weigh you down or give in ways that are frivolous or pride-driven. Instead, ask God for wisdom to set goals that honor Him and align with your ability, while leaving room for generosity and faith.

The purpose of this devotional is not to accumulate wealth, but to invite God into your financial life. You will find Scriptures, reflections, and journaling space to help you think

deeply and pray about your financial choices. May this journey lead you to freedom and peace as you learn to cast your financial cares upon Jesus.

Priorities

“No one can serve two masters; for either he will hate the one and love the other, or else he will be loyal to the one and despise the other. You cannot serve God and mammon.” — Matthew 6:24 (NKJV)

Money is a tool, not a master. Jesus reminds us that our loyalty cannot be divided. If money drives our decisions, then God takes second place. But when God is our priority, our financial decisions reflect His wisdom and purpose. Use this devotional to realign your heart so that your spending, saving, and giving are all acts of worship to Him.

Day 1 – Treasure in Heaven

Scripture:

Jesus said to him, ‘If you want to be perfect, go, sell what you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow Me.’ — Matthew 19:21 (NKJV)

Reflection & Question:

The rich young ruler valued possessions more than discipleship. Jesus reminds us that wealth is temporary, but following Him is eternal. What areas of your life are you clinging to material things instead of fully following Christ?

Journal:

Day 2 – Contentment Over Gain

Scripture:

Now godliness with contentment is great gain. For we brought nothing into this world, and it is certain we can carry nothing out. — 1 Timothy 6:6–7 (NKJV)

Reflection & Question:

True wealth is not in what we own but in living with contentment and godliness. Are there purchases or habits that reveal discontentment in your heart? What might God be asking you to simplify today?

Journal:

Day 3 – The Heart Follows the Treasure

Scripture:

For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also. —
Matthew 6:21 (NKJV)

Reflection & Question:

Our money reveals what we value most. God calls us to invest in eternal things. What does your current spending reveal about your heart? How can you direct your finances toward Kingdom purposes today?

Journal:

Day 4 – Trusting Daily Provision

Scripture:

Give us this day our daily bread. — Matthew 6:11 (NKJV)

Reflection & Question:

God cares about your daily needs. Trusting Him with finances means asking for provision one day at a time. Where are you anxious about tomorrow's money instead of trusting God for today?

Journal:

Day 5 – Guarding Against Greed

Scripture:

And He said to them, ‘Take heed and beware of covetousness, for one’s life does not consist in the abundance of the things he possesses.’ — Luke 12:15 (NKJV)

Reflection & Question:

Greed can quietly rule our hearts if we measure life by possessions. What financial habit or desire may reflect greed rather than gratitude? What step can you take to shift toward generosity?

Journal:

Day 6 – Wisdom in Counsel

Scripture:

Without counsel, plans go awry, but in the multitude of counselors they are established. — Proverbs 15:22 (NKJV)

Reflection & Question:

Wise financial decisions often come from seeking Godly counsel. Who can you invite to speak into your financial choices this week?

Journal:

Day 7 – Faithful with Little

Scripture:

He who is faithful in what is least is faithful also in much; and he who is unjust in what is least is unjust also in much. — Luke 16:10 (NKJV)

Reflection & Question:

God calls us to be trustworthy with small amounts before He entrusts us with more. How can you practice faithfulness with what you already have today?

Journal:

Final Thoughts

As you close this 30-day journey, remember that God desires for you to walk in freedom—not weighed down by financial stress, nor enslaved by the pursuit of wealth. True freedom comes when money serves as a tool to glorify Him, bless others, and provide for your needs in a balanced way.

Set financial goals that are realistic and Godly. Avoid chasing after things beyond your means, and do not give frivolously without prayerful consideration. Instead, seek to honor God with each dollar entrusted to you. Choose contentment, generosity, and wise stewardship. In this way, you will find joy in knowing that your finances are aligned with God's will, and that you are truly casting all your cares upon Jesus.

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Treasure in Heaven is a 30-day journey designed to help you:

- Build Godly spending habits rooted in wisdom
- Pursue contentment over consumerism
- Trust in God's daily provision

- Embrace generosity as worship
