It is the only international school in the area officially authorized to deliver the Cambridge International Curriculum and the first certified center for IGCSE and AS–A Level examinations. The school has also been recognized for three continual years by the Ministry of Education as the top educational provider in the region.

Driven by a deep commitment to excellence, Ajyal Al Marefaah empowers students to grow both academically and personally in a diverse and inclusive global community. School Profile & Context

Ajyal Almarefaah International School is an English-medium international school located in the Jazan Region, serving both boys' and girls' sections through a structured and inclusive educational environment. The school offers a comprehensive academic pathway across four educational levels: Kindergarten, Basic, Elementary, and Secondary, ensuring continuity of learning and development from early childhood through pre-university education. The student body represents a diverse demographic drawn from the local and expatriate community, reflecting a range of cultural and educational backgrounds. Ajyal Almarefaah International School is supported by a qualified and dedicated team of teaching and administrative staff, including experienced educators with strong subject expertise and a commitment to student-centered learning and continuous professional development. 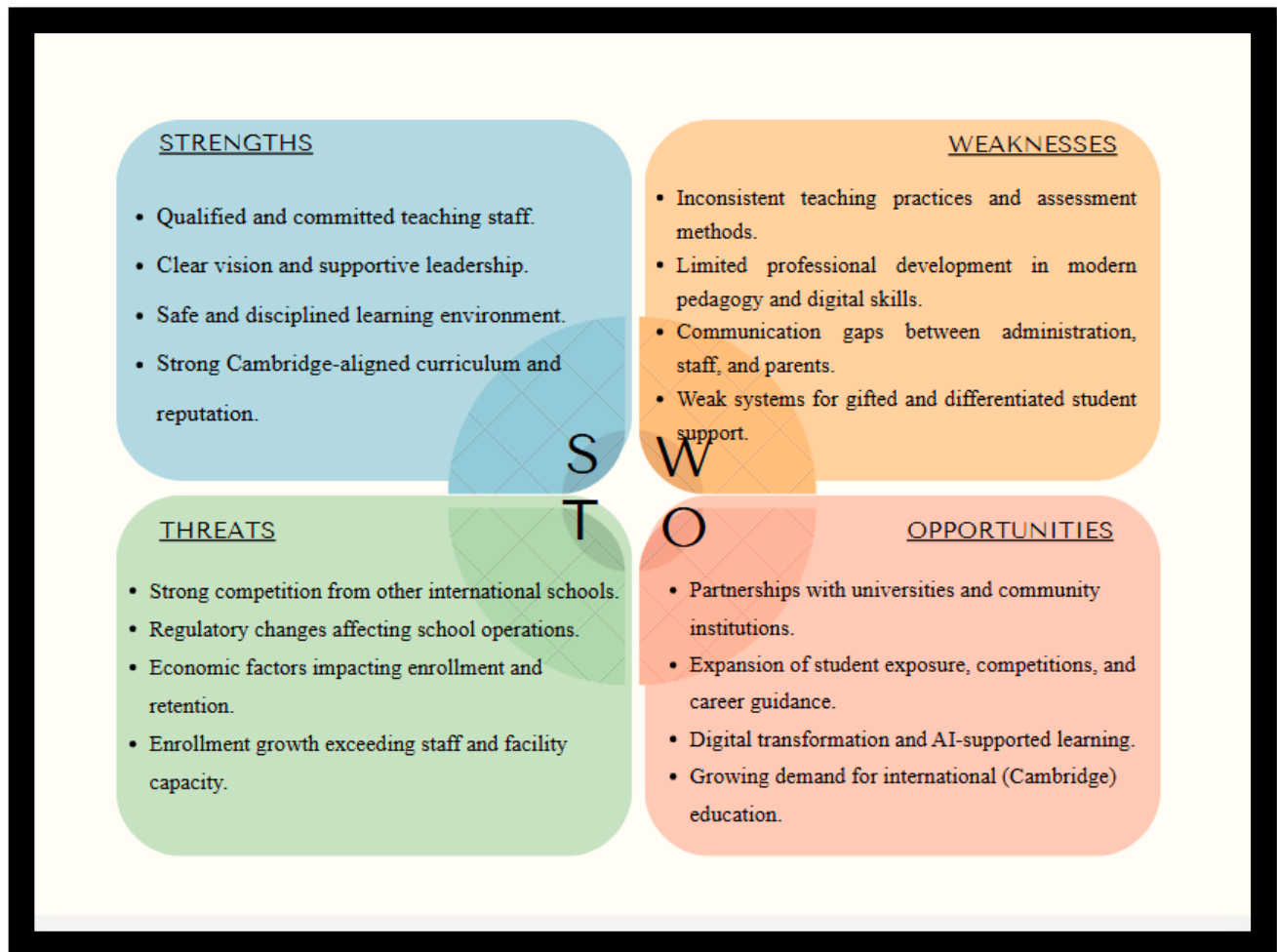
