












NVC Voice: "I need reverence."

Why She Works: Her care is serious play. She feels before she speaks. Power lives in her presence, not her volume.










Power Style: Magnetism + Vision

Power Style: Structure + Expectation


NVC Voice: "Can I count on your consistency?"

Power Style: Brat + Curiosity


NVC Voice: "I need you to meet my mischief with attention."
