



EPI Pilot Report - Co-Parenting Case (OFW + Text Integration)

This EPI report analyzes cross-platform co-parenting communication (OFW and iMessage) from August-November 2024. Speaker B consistently demonstrates high emotional investment, child-centered tone, and co-parenting reliability. Speaker A fails to mirror this tone, often escalating in response to boundaries and refusing coordination.





Speaker Tone Comparison

These patterns meet clinical and legal thresholds for emotional abuse and demonstrate sustained relational imbalance.

Quantitative analysis confirms:

- Emotional labor imbalance
- Zero empathy echo from Speaker A
- Multiple instances of control, withholding, and escalation
- A Co-Parenting Reliability Index of +18 (Speaker B) vs. -12 (Speaker A)

Control Dynamics Summary

Speaker A displayed control-adjacent behavior through relational withholding and escalation when boundaries were set. These included dismissive reactions to co-parenting requests, refusal to use agreed-upon tools, and emotionally cold or reactive messaging patterns. Notable examples: - 'You are interfering in our plans.' (Dismissive, iMessage) - 'Hang up now.' (Controlling, iMessage) - No acknowledgment of coordinated support via OFW.

Optional Metrics Interpretation Guide

Optional Metrics Interpretation Guide:

1. Response Ratio: Measures the consistency of message acknowledgment. - 70%+ response rate = healthy engagement - 40-70% = uneven, possible disengagement - Below 40% = concerning pattern of emotional unavailability or avoidance

2. Emotional Investment:

Quantifies emotional tone effort.

- Scores above +15 = high emotional investment
- Scores between 0-15 = neutral to mildly engaged
- Negative scores = dismissive, controlling, or emotionally harmful tone pattern

3. Silence Clusters:

Flags moments where emotional outreach is met with silence or cold response.

- 0-1 instances = normal
- 2-3 = may indicate emotional detachment
- 4+ = repeated relational invalidation, often tied to coercive control

4. Boundary Violation Heatmap:

Flags escalation following healthy boundary-setting.

- 0 = no reactive control
- 1-2 = mild reactivity or power dynamics
- 3+ = repeated resistance to regulation; clinically concerning

5. Empathy Echo Tracker:

Checks whether emotional language is mirrored.

- 3+ mirrored responses = healthy co-regulation
- 1-2 = minimal mirroring
- 0 = red flag for emotional neglect or manipulation

6. Co-Parenting Reliability Index:

Scored on supportive, regulated, child-focused behavior minus control.

- +10 or more = highly reliable parenting tone
- 0 to +10 = moderate consistency
- Negative = emotionally or logistically unsafe co-parenting behavior
