Choosing a Ukulele

Ukuleles typically come in one of four sizes (not counting the bass ukulele):

- **Soprano**—The smallest of the four ukuleles described here, this is the traditional instrument that people often picture when they think of a ukulele. As the smallest, it puts out the quietest sound and is very portable. It can be a good choice for children and those with smaller hands (though it is also played by those with larger hands).
- **Concert**—This is a very popular choice for many players. A little larger than the soprano, it puts out a slightly fuller sound. There is also a bit more room on the fret board for those who prefer a bit more room for forming chords.
- Tenor—This is a bit larger still and offers a still fuller sound. It is a popular choice for those who play guitar, as the frets are a bit larger (not as large as a guitar, but larger than the soprano or concert ukulele).
- **Baritone**—The largest of the four, the baritone is strung and played differently than the others. Playing the baritone is like playing the bottom 4 strings of a guitar.

The best way to choose the right size for you is to play some ukuleles; get the feel of each size and choose the size that feels most comfortable for you. If you don't have the opportunity to try before buying, consider the concert; it's a popular size for many players. If you have experience playing guitar, then you might want to consider the tenor or baritone. Keep in mind that the baritone is strung differently (more like a guitar); unless you specifically want that mini-guitar arrangement, it may be better to stick with one of the other three sizes.

Strumming the Ukulele

Ukulele Sizes (source: Martin Guitars)

Most players strum the ukulele using either their index finger or thumb; do what feels comfortable to you. Sometimes, players strum with multiple fingers to get a bigger sound. Initially, at least, use the index finger or thumb.

How you strum the ukulele can affect the sound you generate. For example, a down-strum (hitting the top string first and strumming down through the bottom string) sounds a bit different than an up-strum (hitting the bottom string first and strumming up through the top).


As a beginner, focus on down strums first, allowing yourself to get used to that basic, top-down strum. Then, work on up-strums and combinations of down-up-down-up. There are a variety of additional strumming patterns, but most of those are beyond the scope of this guide.

One strumming pattern worth learning early on is what's commonly called the Island Strum. It involves six strums per measure, using the following pattern: down-down-up-up-down-up. This pattern can be applied to **a lot** of songs

20 Chords That Give You Access to Countless Songs

While there are countless ukulele chords, the good news is that you can start playing many songs knowing as few as three chords. Here are some chords that will allow you to play a huge number of songs. As you look at the chord diagrams, the top (or 4th) string is on the left and the bottom (or 1st) string is on the right. The rows indicate the frets on your ukulele.



Note: Yes, there are actually 21 chords listed here; however, the E chord is frequently avoided by many players, and doesn't appear in any of the songs in this book.

I've provided links to video or audio performances of many of the songs. I've included play-along versions where I was able to find something suitable; other links are just provided to help you gain familiarity with the song and aren't really suitable for playing along.

Note: Play-along versions may not exactly match our versions, but are close enough for you to play with.

Symbols Used on Song Sheets

A number of symbols are used in this book to indicate how to play certain chords. Following are explanations of those symbols:

Exam- ple	Description
[Ci]	Strum the chord once, and move on; the chord only counts as one beat. If this symbol shows up at the end of the song, strum once and mute the strings.
[C-]	Strum the chord once, and let the strings ring out for the rest of the measure. In some cases, the cord may not run a full measure, but the idea is let the audience hear each string by using a slow strum.
[C/] [/G]	The chords share a measure. The chord with the slash on the right represents the first half of the measure; the chord with the slash on the left represents the second half of the measure. Typically, each chord is played with 2 down strums.
[C/G]	Two chords sharing a measure listed within the same set of brackets indicate that the measure is played as an island strum, with the first chord getting the first to down strums (d d) and the second chord completing the island strum progression (u udu).
[C]	A vertical line after a chord (outside of the brackets) indicates that the chord is played for two measures.


