completely; absolutely

IMPLY (v.)

to express something subtly or indirectly

NONETHELESS (adv.)

in spite of that; nevertheless

INFUSED (adj.)

to be filled or saturated with something

BLATANTLY (adv.)

in a manner that is highly obvious

DEADPAN (n.)

a face that is blank and without expression

LUCRATIVE (adj.)

something that produces wealth or profit



BURDEN OF PROOF (n.)

the obligation to prove a point during an argument/dispute

OFF THE HOOK (idiom)

to be free from a burden or duty

UNSOLICITED (adj.)

something unrequested and often unwanted

DEBRIS (n.)

rough, broken pieces of an artifact, often from destruction

RECIPIENT (n.)

a person or thing that is receiving something



DEVOID (adj.) completely without

INNOCUOUS (adj.)
harmless; meaningless

COUNTERPART (n.)
a person or thing that closely resembles another

AMYGDALA (n.)

a small mass in the brain that plays a role in emotional regulation

UNDERMINE (v.)

to weaken or undercut someone/something

WEEP (v.)
