#### THE ESSENTIAL ROLE OF PHARMACISTS IN RABIES PREVENTION AND EDUCATION

Pharmacists play an essential and evolving role in the prevention and education of rabies, serving as frontline healthcare providers within communities and bridging significant gaps in public health awareness, vaccination accessibility, and postexposure care. Through their accessible position, strong medical knowledge, and ability to connect with the public, pharmacists can have a profound impact on reducing rabies mortality and promoting safe practices.

#### Rabies: A Preventable yet Fatal Threat

Rabies is a highly fatal zoonotic disease caused by a virus that affects the central nervous system and is most commonly transmitted through the bite or scratch of an infected animal. Despite being almost 100% fatal once symptoms appear, rabies is entirely preventable through appropriate wound timely management and post-exposure prophylaxis (PEP) or pre-exposure immunization. highest burden falls on underserved populations in rural areas, where immediate medical access is lacking and awareness about proper wound care and vaccine schedules remains low.

#### Pharmacists as Vaccinators and Care Managers

One of the most significant advances in rabies prevention has been the increasing involvement of pharmacists vaccinators. Community as pharmacists, owing to their high accessibility and daily contact with the public, are ideally positioned to offer both pre-exposure and postexposure rabies vaccination. Their participation is essential in high-risk groups, such as veterinary students or travelers, by administering vaccines, ensuring adherence to dosing schedules, and monitoring antibody levels for ongoing protection. Innovative pharmacy-led programs demonstrated success in reaching more individuals and easing pressure on hospitals and primary care centers.

#### **Education, Advocacy, and Public Awareness**

another Education is cornerstone of the role. pharmacist's **Pharmacists** address misinformation, dispel local myths (such as inappropriate wound care using oils or herbs), and advocate for completion of vaccine series after animal bites. By regularly engaging with the community, pharmacists build trust and provide crucial information about the life-saving value of washing, prompt wound seeking medical attention, and adhering to vaccination protocols. Their role in conducting training sessions, workshops, and continuous education significantly boosts knowledge not only among the public, but also among pharmacy students and other health professionals

#### Surveillance, Policy, and Collaboration

Pharmacists contribute to rabies control through active participation in surveillance, early notification of suspected cases, and collaboration with healthcare teams for PEP management. They monitor vaccine storage, counsel on adverse effects, and document vaccination histories, all of which are vital for robust public health tracking and outbreak response

#### **EFFECT OF CROP ROTATION ON SOIL HEALTH**

#### **Introduction:**

Crop rotation was a method of vegetable farming before the rise of chemical pesticides. By using this technique the vegetable cultivator used to prevent the soil erosion, and gain more profit. Due to increased pollution, soil erosoin, climate change, this crop rotation techniques is not practised now days. But this crop rotation technique is best work only in long term duration.

#### What is Crop Rotation?

"Crop rotation is the practice of using the natural biological and physical properties of crops to benefit the growth, helath and competitive advantage of other crops. In this process the soil and its life are also benefited. The desired result is a farm which is more productive and to a greater extent self-reliant in resources" (Mohler & Johnson, 2009, P, 5).

#### Effective way of doing crop rotation:

- 1. Address the problem to solve in the farm area.
- 2. Find the resources to solve it efficiently.
- 3. Collect the information of crop rotation technique.
- 4. Analyze the information of crop rotation.
- 5. Plan crop rotation technique properly.
- 6. Start to implement the crop rotation.
- 7. Monitor the rotation implemented.
- 8. Adjust the plan of crop rotation as per climate, soil health and insects to avoid on crops.

#### Effects of crops rotation on:

#### 1. Soil fertility

Soil has tiny bits called organic matter and clay that hold plant food, but plants can't use all of it right away. Farmers grow different crops, use cover crops and add natural fertilizers like compost or manure to keep the soil healthy. Some plants, like bean helps to add nitrogen to the soil, which other plants need. When crop grow, thay take nutrients from the soil and their leftover parts put some back. Good soil helps to absorb water and air more better, helping roots grow strongly.

By planning which crops to grow and when farmers keep the soil rich and plants healthy.

#### 2. Soil Hardness:

If the soil isn't healthy then when it get dried, it becomes hard or tough, which act as barrier for growth of seed and roots of plants. But if soil has lots of small pieces termed aggregates or enough organic matter in it, then it will not become hard or tough either it stays loose and soft, even after rain. Specially by growing the rotations crop like grasses and legumes can make soil healthier. As the grasses and legumes contain lots of roots, so it breakdowns the hard soil and another thing that these plants provides a food for worms. So that worms will make soil crumbly and easier for plants to grow.

#### **Conclusion:**

Crop rotation is a long term technique that keeps soil healthy and improves the natural strengths of different plants. In this modern area of agriculture it is not practised more but it helps to the soil rich, loose or soft and full of organic matter. By neat and proper planning of crop rotation, farmers can enrich the soil health, protect the soil and plant diseases, and boost his earning and his yield and make the farms more sustainable for future.

## Giving Visibility, Giving Safety: Reflective Collar Drives for Stray Dogs

On India's busy streets, especially after dark, stray dogs often find themselves in the crossfire of speeding vehicles, disoriented by headlights, and invisible to drivers who may not spot them in time to respond. It's a heartbreaking but common sight —innocent animals injured or killed in avoidable road accidents. To address this very issue, a thoughtful and compassionate initiative has been spreading across different cities of India: equipping stray dogs with reflective collars.

Unlike conventional awareness drives, this intervention is practical, low-cost, and immediately life-saving. Reflective collars, which shine in headlights at night, increase the street visibility of community dogs, significantly reducing the risk of accidents. But more than just an accessory, these collars become symbols of safety, dignity, and recognition for stray animals often ignored by the urban rush.

Between May and July this year, three heartening collaring drives were conducted—each backed by passionate collaborators, volunteers, and animal lovers who believe that every life matters. The events are powerful examples of how communities can come together to make cities safer for both animals and humans.

#### **Surat: The Beginning Spark (9th May 2025)**

The first collaring drive in this series took place in Surat on 9th May, in collaboration with Roll Me Around. Known for its emphasis on mobility, community care, and awareness-building, the organization worked hand in hand with local supporters to reach stray dogs in key areas of the city.

Bright orange and neon green reflective collars were gently fastened on community dogs who had often been missed in the blur of headlights. The drive not only improved their visibility but also captured the attention of pedestrians and commuters, who were quick to ask: "What are these collars for?"

That curiosity was the beginning of greater awareness. As one participant reflected:

"When people see these collars glowing in the night, they realize someone cares for these animals. It shifts the narrative—dogs are not nuisances, they are lives worth protecting."

For Roll Me Around, the initiative was about giving voice to those without words. In just one evening, dozens of dogs became safer on the roads, and a ripple of empathy spread among citizens.

#### **Delhi: Youth Leading the Way (4th June 2025)**

The second leg of this reflective collar journey led to Delhi on 4th June, where Hindu Paw Parazzi, a vibrant student-led initiative at Hindu College, joined forces with youth leaders Devesh Meena and Eva Singla.

Delhi, a city marked by both its bustling traffic and enormous stray dog population, urgently required such interventions. The sight of reflective collars here carried a powerful symbolism: the youth were not only safeguarding lives but also rewriting the relationship between urban humans and community animals.

As expressed during the drive:

"Kindness doesn't always demand grand gestures—sometimes it's just about ensuring a dog gets home safe through the night."

#### Another perspective added:

"We want people to stop seeing dogs as a problem. These collars make a statement: they live among us, and our responsibility is to let them coexist safely."

The Delhi collaring drive became a talking point across the college campus. Conversations over canteen tea revolved around animal safety and community responsibility, underscoring how one simple act can stir larger waves of consciousness.





## Guwahati: The Stray Project in Action (6th July 2025)

On 6th July, the journey moved to Guwahati, where The Stray Project under the leadership of Arpita Baruah and Papori Hazarika carried forward the mission with infectious energy.

The Northeastern city, rich in culture yet equally challenged by stray animal concerns, provided a vibrant backdrop. Volunteers here covered marketplaces, residential neighborhoods, and even temple surroundings, ensuring that dogs often at risk during nighttime festivities or markets were made visible.

Both Arpita and Papori strongly emphasized that animal welfare must walk hand in hand with civic responsibility. Their vision was echoed in words such as:

"Every reflective collar we put on today is a promise that we will stand with our strays. This is not charity—it's justice."

And further reinforced with the sentiment:

"In Guwahati, these dogs are part of daily life. By collaring them, we're not just making roads safer; we're embracing them as part of the city's heartbeat."

Children in localities gathered joyfully to see the glowing effect of reflective collars after dark, clapping and calling the dogs "superstars of the street." That sight alone confirmed that awareness had taken root in young hearts.

#### **Beyond Collars: The Movement of Compassion**

While the reflective collar initiative appears modest, its larger impact cannot be overstated. Road safety for community animals means reduced accidents for drivers too. Reduced hostility towards dogs means safer neighborhoods, and improved public health outcomes, since cared-for community animals are less vulnerable to stress and aggression.

But there's something even more profound: these drives humanize urban spaces. They demonstrate that modern Indian cities, often perceived as chaotic and indifferent, can pause for acts of kindness.

From Surat to Delhi to Guwahati, three different cities, three different collaborators, and one common message resounded: "Every life counts."

The true magic of these drives came not only from collars but also from conversations sparked in the community. As one passerby in Guwahati remarked after watching volunteers at work:

"I used to think strays are a nuisance. But today I saw young people put collars on them with such love. Maybe we need to change, not the dogs."

#### The Road Ahead

Reflective collaring drives cannot and should not remain isolated events. They are glimpses of what sustained compassion can achieve when scaled up with community networks, corporate partnerships, and civic authorities. With thousands of stray dogs across India, the road ahead involves taking this initiative nationwide—whether through schools, colleges, NGOs, or even municipal collaborations. In the spirit of collective action, one can say that the reflective collars are not just for dogs—they are mirrors reflecting our humanity.

And with every glowing collar on a community dog, that greatness comes a step closer.

#### **Outcomes and Impact of the Collaring Drives**

The impacts of these drives have been both immediate and encouraging:

- More than 200 stray dogs across the three cities were fitted with reflective collars, instantly improving their nighttime visibility and safety on the roads.
- Local traffic reports and eyewitness accounts noted a reduction in vehicle-dog collisions and near-miss accidents in the areas where collars were distributed.
- The drives heightened community awareness and empathy, encouraging many citizens to participate actively in looking out for stray dogs, reporting injured animals, and supporting humane treatment.
- The Delhi drive inspired college-led animal welfare activities and engagements, helping embed concern for strays into student culture.
- Broader media and social media coverage amplified the message, spreading awareness to thousands beyond the immediate locations.
- The collars helped shift public perception from viewing street dogs as nuisances towards seeing them as worthy of protection and respect, fostering coexistence.

These outcomes prove that such practical, lowcost interventions can save lives and change communities for the better, one glowing collar at a time.



## EMPOWERING TOMORROW'S LEADERS: NATIONAL YOUTH PARLIAMENT SCHEME DEBUTS IN SOLAPUR

Democracy is built not only on the foundations of institutions but also on the active engagement and understanding of its citizens—especially the youth. The launch of the National Youth Parliament Scheme (Kishore Sabha) in Solapur district marked an important milestone in this democratic journey, igniting enthusiasm and responsibility among young minds for the first time at Shree Swaminarayan Gurukul International School.

## EMPOWERING LEARNING: EDUCATIONAL KIT DISTRIBUTION REACHES SCHOOLS IN ALAHALLI, NAGANSUR, AND JULE SOLAPUR

Education is the key that opens doors of opportunity, yet many children face challenges due to lack of basic learning materials. To bridge this important gap, educational kit distribution drives were organized across three locations — Sarkari Kannada Hiriya Prathmika Shale, Alahalli (23rd June), SJB Pre Primary School, Nagansur (27th June), and Shri Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Madhyamik Aashram Prashala, Jule Solapur, Maharashtra (5<sup>th</sup> July). These initiatives aimed to provide students with essential tools and inspire a love for learning in diverse educational settings.

### The Spirit of Giving: Why Educational Kits Matter

An educational kit goes beyond textbooks and stationery; it symbolizes hope, empowerment, and equal chances for all students. Children's academic growth is deeply influenced by the availability of materials like notebooks, pencils, colors, and geometry sets that help them participate actively in class and nurture creativity. Organizers of these drives believe that removing resource barriers can improve attendance and engagement, helping children develop self-confidence and a positive attitude towards schooling. As one volunteer shared:

## Alahalli's Primary School: Lighting Young Minds (23rd June)

The first distribution took place at the Sarkari Kannada Hiriya Prathmika Shale, Alahalli, a government primary school where enthusiasm brimmed among students receiving their new kits. The air was filled with excitement as children opened their packs of notebooks, colorful pencils, and erasers, ready to learn with renewed spirit.

A teacher reflected on the significance:
