WHAT IS FAIRTRADE?

When you see the FAIRTRADE Mark, it means that the product has been independently certified to ensure the following:



- Producers have received a stable price which covers the costs of sustainably producing their crop
- Producers receive a Fairtrade Premium, which they invest in community improvements
- Sustainable agricultural practices which protect and improve the environment and ensure the health and safety of workers
- Support for small farmers to gain a stronger position
- Consumers feel a closer link with people who grow the products they buy

BENEFITS FOR YOUR BUSINESS

- Corporate behaviour is under intense scruting by an increasingly discerning public who make ethical choices when spending their money
- Switching to Fairtrade adds a feel-good
- Offering Fairtrade products to your staff and customers demonstrates that you are a caring business
