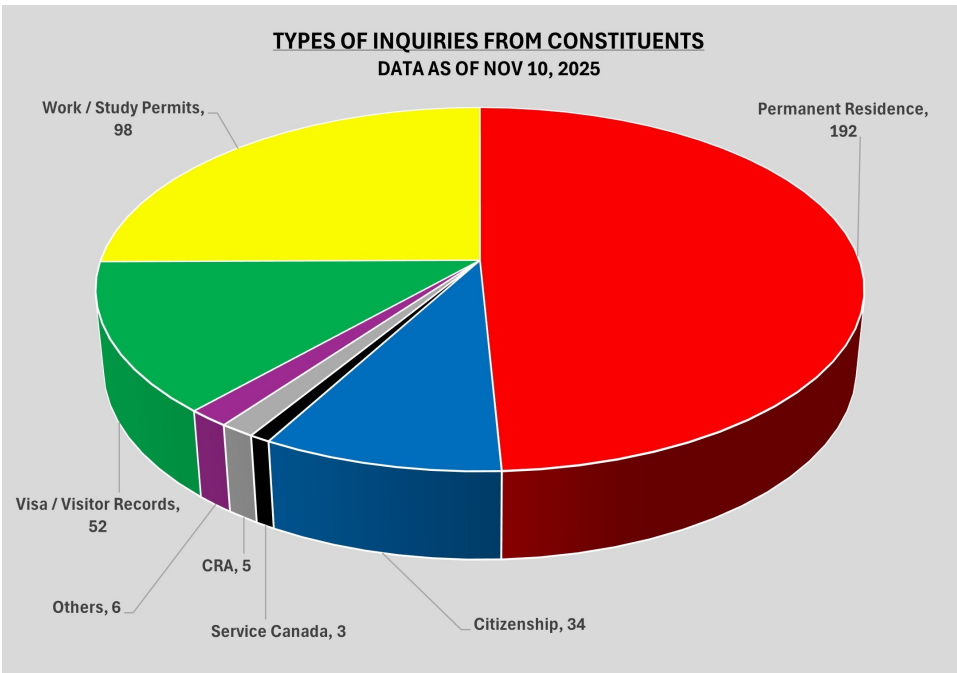

How have we performed in the four months since July 2025?



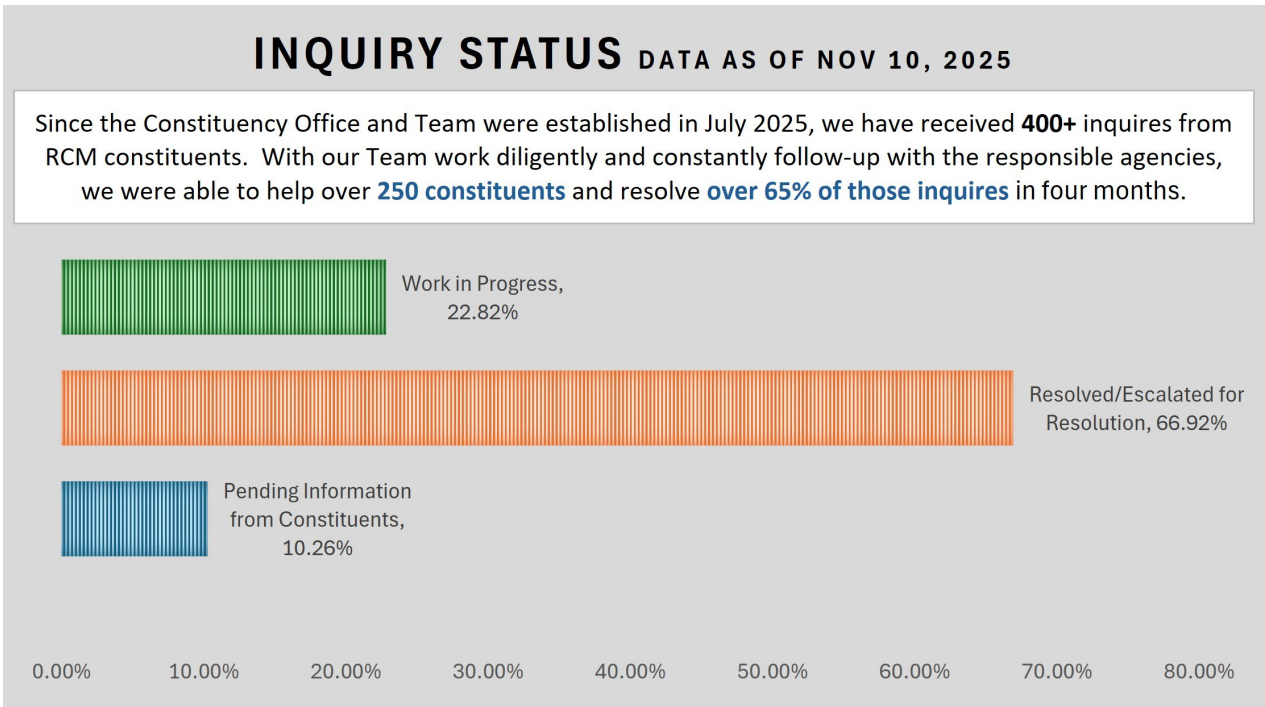
While I have been advocating for you at the House of Commons in Ottawa, my team at the Constituency Office have been working diligently handling service requests and government inquiries.

I have asked them to summarize their work thus far graphically as shown on the left.

The graph to the left shows government agencies breakdown by the types of requests, totalling more than 400.

The bar chart on the right indicates how many cases are completed verses those that are in progress.

As the backlogs of various government departments keep growing, the wait-time for our advocacy is expected to continue to increase. We appreciate your patience. Rest assured we will keep up our effort holding the government to account and advocate for you.

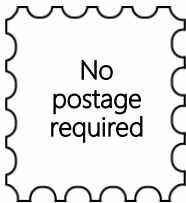
