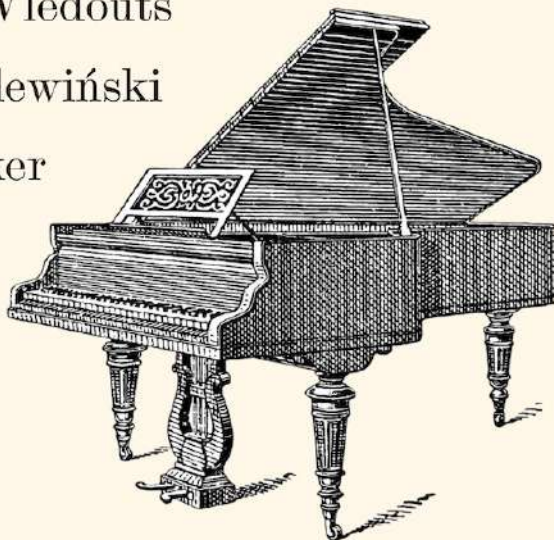

Who is Lagrandt?

We are a new historical-performance (HP) orchestra specializing in the Romantic classics—think Beethoven, Brahms, & Tchaikovsky. The ensemble debuted last year at the Conservatorium van Amsterdam, and now we are preparing to open our 2025-26 season with Tchaikovsky's Third Symphony.

Why Tchaikovsky?

Tchaikovsky is a household name to many, most famous for his ballets *The Nutcracker* and *Swan Lake*. This particular symphony, which was composed the same year as *Swan Lake* (1875), shares the magic that makes his ballets so unforgettable.

What is HP?

Historical performance means many things in music, but most importantly to us, it is a way of interpreting a piece. Our orchestra uses original or replicas of instruments from the 19th century and incorporates forgotten sounds from the time. This helps us to bring a new dimension and aesthetic to our performances.

This will be the first time Tchaikovsky's Third Symphony is performed on period instruments!
