NRCS - Cumberland & Salem Field Offices

NRCS FY2022 Financial Assistance Program (EQIP etc.) signup date is October 22nd. FY2022 ACEP signup date is October 29th. Proposals for Cooperative Agreement for Equity are due October 25th. Soil & Water Cost Share Rates-

Mike discussed the updated Soil and Water cost share rates for irrigation wells. After several years of issues with the cost share rates for high production agricultural wells it appears that the costs are now reflective of in-field installation costs. This has been an issue mainly for the Southern NJ for the installation of 8-12 inch irrigation wells.

The annual conference is scheduled for November 10th at the Freehold SCD office. Currently there NJACD is evaluating if the conference will take place in person, virtual, or be rescheduled to a later date.
