

# Syllable Pairs Game

## How to play:

Print out the sheets and stick them to card before cutting them out. There are enough cards for three different sets of words, so you may not need to print out all pages.

You can choose the word pairs you want to include.

You can laminate the sheets if they're printed on thick paper so the ink is not visible on the reverse.

Mix the cards up and lay them on the table, face down.

Players take turns to pick up two cards. If the cards have words that contain the same number of syllables the player keeps the cards and has another turn.

If the words on the cards don't have the same number of syllables the player replaces them and the next player has their turn.

Players should be encouraged to say the words aloud as they read them and to clap or tap the number of syllables as they do so.

Once all the cards are collected by the players, the player with the most pairs wins.

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## 1 syllable words: (e.g. hat)

cat, star, dog, hat, zip, bag, hen, sock, truck, clock, cup, map.

#### 2 syllable words: (e.g. rab-bit)

mirror, scooter, biscuit, necklace, rainbow, rabbit, napkin, carrot, robot, pencil, flower, window, handbag, pizza, lemon, button, basket, lipstick, table, sofa.

## 3 syllable words: (e.g. croc-o-dile)

envelope, crocodile, butterfly, potato, tomato, chocolate, dinosaur, caravan, motorbike, cucumber, raspberry, sunflower, magician, elephant, coconut, banana.

#### 4 syllable words: (e.g. hel-i-cop-ter)

helicopter, dictionary, caterpillar, television, aquarium, rhinoceros, macaroni, calculator.
