# International Coastal Cleanup Day observed in Cuddalore

Chidambaram, Sep-22: As part of the observance of International Coastal Cleanup Day, a large-scale beach cleaning initiative was organized on 20th September 2025 at Samiyarpettai Beach, near Bhuvanagiri in Cuddalore district.

The event was spearheaded by the Centre of Advanced Study in Marine Biology, Annamalai University, in association with the M.S. Swaminathan Research Foundation (MSSRF) and the Environmental Information, Awareness, Capacity Building and Livelihood Programme (EIACP PC-RP), with financial support from the National Centre for Coastal Research (NCCR).

During the campaign, 200 volunteers actively participated and removed nearly 2 metric tons of waste, comprising both degradable and non-degradable materials accumulated along the shoreline. The cleanup drive not only restored the beauty of the coast but also contributed significantly towards protecting marine biodiversity, which faces increasing threats from plastics and other pollutants entering the oceans.

The event commenced with a formal welcome to Dr. S. Arivudainambi, Member, Vice-Chancellor Convener Committee of Annamalai University, by Prof. T. Ramanathan, Director, Centre of Advanced Study in Marine Biology. Dr. Arivudainambi flagged off the event, administered the pledge, and urged participants to take responsibility in conserving the coastal environment. The programme was held in the presence of Prof. S. Sriam, Dean, Faculty of Marine Sciences, Annamalai University; Dr. P. Murugesan, Associate Professor and Programme Coordinator; Dr. A. Gopalakrishnan, Assistant Professor; and Dr. B. Deivisgamani, Associate Professor and Deputy Coordinators of the programme and Public Relations Officer N. Suresh were present.

Faculty members, research scholars, students, local volunteers, A. Shankar, Fishermen Traditional Panchayat Leader of Samiyarpettai, and SHG members enthusiastically took part in the initiative, reflecting strong community participation and commitment to environmental

conservation. Organizers emphasized that such initiatives are vital for raising awareness about the ecological importance of coastal ecosystems and the urgent need to curb plastic pollution and littering habits. They highlighted that mismanaged waste severely impacts not only marine life but also the livelihoods of coastal communities that depend on healthy oceans for fishing and tourism.

Following the cleanup, the segregated waste was responsibly handed over to village administrators to ensure safe disposal, underscoring the organizers' focus on sustainable waste management practices. The programme concluded with a collective call for continuous community-driven action to keep beaches clean, promote sustainable coastal practices, and instill a culture of environmental stewardship, particularly among the younger generation. # E-filing training on police cases conducted in Chennai

Chennai, Sept. 22 : A training and consultation meeting on e-filing for police cases was held under the leadership of Chennai Police Commissioner A. Arun and Principal Sessions Judge S. Karthikeyan.

In Chennai city, criminal cases filed across the 12 police districts are being given priority in investigation and court proceedings to ensure justice for victims and proper punishment for offenders. Based on the Police Commissioner's directions, officers have been instructed to take appropriate measures to speed up the process. To avoid delays in court proceedings due to late submission of final reports, charge sheets, and appeal documents, the e-filing service is being actively used to streamline investigation-related documentation and judicial processes.

Accordingly, a combined training and consultation session was organized at the 2nd floor of the Vepery Police Commissionerate, under the leadership of Principal Sessions Judge S. Karthikeyan, along with 16th Additional Sessions Judge Arumaiselvi, Chief Metropolitan Magistrate R. Girijarani, 4th Metropolitan Magistrate Anitha



Anand, 3rd Metropolitan Magistrate C. Sundarapandian, and other judicial officers.

Commissioner A. Arun discussed the practical challenges faced by police personnel in e-filing, clarified doubts, and guided officers on rectifying errors, improving documentation, and ensuring smooth coordination with the judiciary. He emphasized that these efforts will

strengthen progress in investigation and court cases.

Also present were Additional Commissioner of Police (Central Crime Branch) A. Radhika, Deputy Commissioners S. Selvaraj, S.S. Geethanjali, S. Arokiam, P. Geetha (Headquarters), along with police station officers and court duty police personnel.

# Minister Gandhi distributes Rs. 3.67 cr education loans to 63 Students in Ranipet

Ranipet, Sept. 22 : At a mega education loan camp jointly organized by the district administration and the Lead Bank at Arappakkam Annai Meera Polytechnic College, Arcot Union, loans worth Rs.3.67 crore were distributed to 63 students. The program was held under the leadership of District Collector J.U. Chandrakala, and the loans were handed over by Minister R. Gandhi.

Speaking at the event, the Minister said: "In the past four and a half years, the Hon'ble Chief Minister has given priority to education and healthcare by implementing several welfare schemes. Education is a wealth that cannot be stolen, and it is education alone that develops human reasoning. Every student must continue their education with dedication. Once you complete your studies and start working, you must never forget the sacrifices of your parents and should always take care of them-that is a child's foremost duty."

The Minister further added that the district administration, in coordination with the banks, has been conducting education loan camps across Tamil Nadu. Education loans are being extended for



undergraduate, postgraduate, diploma, and overseas studies.

This year, the Tamil Nadu government has set a target of providing ₹2,500 crore in education loans to 1 lakh students across the state. For Ranipet district, the target is to provide 340 crore to 1,500 students. Last year, ₹22.85 crore was distributed to 547 students, while this year so far ₹15.73 crore has been sanctioned to 215 students. In today's camp, loans worth ₹3.67 crore were sanctioned for 63 students.

He also urged banks not to impose excessive conditions or

delay loan approvals, as most applicants belong to poor and middle-class families. "Banks must support them immediately so that they can pursue their education without hurdles," he emphasized.

District Panchayat Chairperson Jayanthi Thurimuthur, Union Council Chairperson Bhuvaneshwari Sathyamath, Lead Bank Manager Sriyanji Kumar, College Founder and Chairman Ramadas, Secretary Damodarani, District Industries Centre General Manager Anandan, and Revenue Officer Anandan were present.
