What happens next?

If you do not give your employer your National Insurance number, there could be a delay in any benefits you claim in future.

If you are receiving benefits and your circumstances change, including changes to your name, address or marital status, you must report this change. To find out how to report a change, go to www.gov.uk/report-benefits-change-circumstances

If you are not receiving benefits and your details change, you must tell HM Revenue & Customs (HMRC) about any changes, including changes to your name, address or marital status. To report a change to HMRC, go to www.gov.uk/tell-hmrc-change-of-details

National Insurance contributions

You pay National Insurance contributions on the money you earn. These may count towards some benefits and the State Pension. For more information about National Insurance contributions, go to www.gov.uk/national-insurance

Right to work in the UK
