BLESSED JOSAPHATA: WOMEN'S HISTORY MONTH



This month, we celebrate Women's History Month by honoring **Blessed Josaphata Hordashevska**, co-foundress of the Sisters Servants of Mary Immaculate (SSMI). Her life stands as an inspiring example of dedication and service, a spirit that continues to resonate within HFH. Born in Lviv, Ukraine, in 1869, Mykhailyna Hordashevska, later Sister Josaphata, felt a strong calling to religious life and service to the poor and marginalized. 1892, the newly-founded congregation of the Sisters Servants of Mary Immaculate was inaugurated in the church in Zhuzhel, and Sister Josaphata was appointed Superior and formation directress. This new congregation aimed to serve the spiritual and material needs of the Ukrainian people, particularly through education and care for the sick and vulnerable.

Sister Josaphata, taking the name Josaphata in religious life, dedicated herself to this mission with unwavering commitment. She played a crucial role in establishing schools, orphanages, and healthcare facilities, leaving an indelible mark on the lives of countless individuals. Her dedication to serving others, especially the most vulnerable, became the cornerstone of the SSMI's mission.

Today, her spirit is deeply felt at Holy Family. It's evident in the compassionate care provided to our residents, the serene atmosphere of our chapel, and the newly dedicated "Josaphata Hordashevska Atrium," a space designed for comfort and connection. This atrium serves as a tangible reminder of her enduring influence.
