



# Game Title: FairPlay

*Fair consumption is a growing movement focused on making informed, ethical decisions about the products we buy, with a strong emphasis on how goods are produced, the environmental impact, and the human rights conditions behind them.*

Let's learn while playing!

## **Goal:**

Winner is the one who arrives first by answering the questions correctly.

## **What you need:**

1 x numbered dice and 4 counters

1 x paper game board

Question Cards: Divided into 6 categories (cosmetics, clothing, food, human, environment, general)

## **How it works:**

First, roll the dice. Roll a dice (1–6) and move forward that many spaces. If you roll a 5, move 5 spaces. When you land on a coloured box, your opponent can ask you a question from the categorie that matches the colour you landed on.

Answer the question correctly to play again. If you don't answer correctly, you lose your turn and the next person plays.
