COUNCIL NEWS

Quoiting Beds. During the January meeting it was decided to sell this land in Bwlch-y-frydd. It will be coming up for sale in the very near future, monies raised will be put into a trust fund, to be spent on local projects and clubs. The final details of this have yet to be discussed.

Institute land at Bwlch-y-ffridd. It has been decided to leave this as a carpark for residents and visitors to use. **County Lines & Cuckooing**.

Our local County Councillor Heulwen Hulme recently attended an event in Newtown, hosted by Newtown Police regarding organised crime gangs coming into the area with a clear aim of setting up drug outlets.

Cllr. Hulme has compiled a report which is very detailed and can be found on the <u>Aberhafesp website News</u> page, but please note, some residents may find the report rather disturbing.

COUNCIL HISTORY

This is the second instalment of the potted version of the workings of your local Community Council written by Jean Morgan, the Clerk to the Council for many years (continued from the January 2019 issue).

In October 1977 the mains water supply was discussed for the Bethel area, and in April 1978 the first move to extend the churchyard was considered and at the same meeting the Council agreed that all old books relating to the Parish kept by the late clerk, Fr. Rogers to be deposited at the National Library of Wales for safe keeping.

In September 1978 the Council decided to finance street lights in both the Aberhafesp and Bwlch-y-ffridd areas. In January 1980 Mr. Percy Davies, treasurer of Aberhafesp Reserve Account and Jubilee Fund attended a meeting to agree the transfer of the £120 to the Centre funds. September 1980 saw the purchase of directional road signs for the Community Centre, a storage shed for the use of organisations, and commemorative plaque for the opening of the Centre by Mr. J.W Jones former Headmaster and Councillor, on July 11th 1979.

In 1981 it was agreed to finance a handrail between school and centre and a contribution of £50 was made towards a strimmer for Aberhafesp Church.

In 1983 the proposed sale of the Parish Room was discussed with mixed feeling expressed by various members of the community. A planning application for the siting of chalets in Disgwilfa Wood was rejected and eventually the issue went to a public inquiry - the Inspector upheld the Council's objections and the application was refused. A proposed airfield at Red House, Caersws was the focal point and a matter of great concern at a public meeting held in January 1986 with representatives of various interested parties attending. In 1986 a further donation of £50 towards mowers for both Aberhafesp Church and Rhydfelin Chapel. Funds were also made available for the erection of a public notice board at the Community Centre and in 1987 a donation of £400 to the Centre for a play area. In 1988 the retirement of Mrs. Nutting as sub postmistress at Bwlch-y-ffridd saw the end of an era - with that facility no longer available.

The arrival of the 90's saw an increase of items to be considered, especially appeals for financial support, planning applications and highway matters due to vast increase in traffic. Mr. & Mrs Powell kindly donated land to extend the Churchyard, the hedge was partially removed to assist visability and a mirror erected to help vehicles leaving Church Lane, but this had to be continually replaced due to theft. The maintenance of the Churchyard is now undertaken by people from various parts of the Parish. A street light was provided outside the school grounds and a donation of £250 towards Aberhafesp School producing a prospectus to be distributed in the catchment area. Speed restriction signs were arranged through Bwlch-y-ffridd and a memorial to the air crew who died on a training mission in this Parish in the war was placed at Aberhafesp Church. The V.E. Day celebrations had been a successful, tasteful event with various organizations contributing.

The 1990's also saw the change in Local Government to a New Unitary authority with local Shire committees and the introduction of the Welsh Assembly. The planting of daffodils in the area is to welcome visitors to our area. Extra support for the Community centre of a total of £180 per year, together with £65 each year towards producing a newsletter have also recently been approved. The precept claimed each year by the Community council is kept as low as possible to prevent too much hardship on the local electorate. Each financial year the Councils resources are stretched due to expenditure estimated by Powys County Council for our recent Community Council Elections of up to £600 and commemorative items for the young people of the Parish for the forthcoming Millennium, and of course the ongoing appeals.



LOCAL HISTORY

Television reception at the Pentre by Brian Poole

Television commenced just before the Second World War in the London area but was suspended during the conflict. Details are from memory so they may not be exact. A giant mast was erected at Crystal Palace after the war, so the service commenced with BBC. A further mast at Sutton Coldfield for the Midlands commenced so east Wales was just able to get a picture. Blaenplwyf transmitter near Aberystwyth was placed in 1957. TV received a huge boost with the coronation of Queen Elizabeth in 1953. ITV commenced in the mid-1950s and BBC2 followed in 1962. The problem for the Welsh valleys was that the signal was very distorted. Newtown solved the problem by having a cable service called Wrights Radio with their workshop office just off Severn Square. Their successors traded until around 2015 when customer switch made the system uneconomic. A radio mast for emergencies (police, ambulance, fire, doctors, vets) had been placed on the Llandinam Hill at Bryn Gwyn, and around 1976 a TV booster from Blaenplwyf was placed. These masts can be viewed from areas of Aberhafesp parish. The TV reception was now solved for Caersws and much of Aberhafesp. The reception was ok at Red House to the east and Rhydlydan to the west but the Pentre was in the shadow of the salient projection of Penstrowed hill and quarry so reception was poor. We moved from Caersws to new build at Hillcrest to the third house on site in 1971. There must have been a further eight houses by 1976 as well as the Hall and the conversion of farm buildings.

A group decided on self-help. We only had to climb 300 yards toward Brynypentre wood for good reception. We therefore placed an aerial at the top of the fields of Sam 'the lodge' and dug a shallow trench alongside the fence line to place a cable to bring the service down in the village so an adequate reception was available. I assume the cable, now long redundant, is still underground coming down the field. Regional services commenced with BBC Wales and Harlech TV. The story was complex for Wales with the Welsh language so S4C commenced in 1982. My wife, Mair, was interviewed with the then 4-year-old son, Emyr, at the forecourt of Emrys's garage in both Welsh and English plus several of the then elderly ladies in 1974. The BBC interviewer was Eifion Lloyd Jones. No one had any idea of TV programmes including the popular soaps such as Coronation Street but knew the radio Archers. These older ladies would have valued the BBC radio services during the war, the Home Service and the Light Programme as the Third Programme did not commence until 1948. The TV interview for the 1974 programme was to emphasise the inadequate reception in many pockets of Wales. The same controversy is still with us today with mobile phone reception. The current system at home is Free Sat with over 100 channels but we only tune in to BBC Wales, 2,4, ITV Wales, Channel 4 and S4C. There are adult channels that commence at 10pm but this lad now in his 83rd year is fast asleep long before midnight. Many others purchase Sky TV especially for sport. There is now a plethora of choice in the Pentre compared with zero in 1970.


