#### FROM THE CHAIR

The Aberhafesp Community Association passes on its sympathy to the friends and family of Humphrey Davies who died recently. Mr Davies was a long time resident of Aberhafesp and former member of the Aberhafesp Community Council. Several weeks before this sad event, the theme of this piece dropped into my lap. Or, more accurately, wormed its way into my consciousness having listened to a Radio 4 programme. Specifically, Wills. Recent surveys estimate that nearly 60% of UK adults have not made a will. 53% of those aged between 50-64 have not made one, nor nearly a quarter of us aged 65 or over. One of life's certainties, despite our best efforts to delay the inevitable, is that we will pass. The outcome in dying without having made a will is as quoted by 'My Will and Probate', as follows. "In the UK, dying without a will means that a person's estate will be distributed according to the rules of intestacy. These rules dictate how assets are divided among family members, with spouses, civil partners, and children typically being the primary beneficiaries. However, the distribution may not align with the deceased individual's wishes or the needs of their loved ones. Dying without a will can also lead to delays, disputes, and additional costs in the probate process. By not having a will, individuals lose the opportunity to have control over their estate and ensure that their assets are passed on in the desired manner."

The worst case – as highlighted by the Radio 4 programme, was the exploitation by fraudsters stealing assets of the deceased by illegally claiming the existence of a will to which they, the fraudsters, were beneficiaries. So what is the upshot of all this? Make sure you have a will. If not, someone is going to benefit and it probably won't be the people you might want to. Writing your Will /Death & Wills /Dying without a will

That's it for this issue except:







To access the AED box, you have to phone 999 or 112

Request an ambulance and tell them your location (see above for post code of the nearest defibrillator). Ambulance control will give you a CODE to open the defibrillator box

(Note: the code for the Community Centre defibrillator is displayed inside the building)

Follow the instructions. Paramedics will be on the way to administer the next stage of the resuscitation process.

Due to insurance purposes, the Code is not displayed on the boxes

Pollinating insects ensure food crops for us and seed eating wildlife need shelter to over-winter. At the Mothers' Union meeting on 16<sup>th</sup> October 3–5pm we are making small bug hotels to tuck into our own gardens or the churchyard hedges. 
